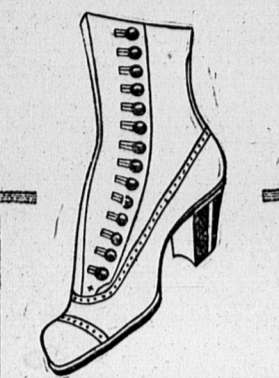

A New York despatch says—A stream of athletes from many parts of the United States and from Canada poured into the city today. Before noon tomorrow 500 men, the cream of America's amateur athletic talent, will be here to participate in the national indoor championships of the Amateur Athletic Union. The events will be pulled off in Madison Square Garden tomorrow night and Wednesday night. Several hundred title holders are entered for the meet and competition of the best is assured for every event. Every man is expected to put forth the best that is in him, for the results of the meet will have an important bearing on the selection of the American representatives at the Olympic games to be held next summer in Stockholm. Heretofore, the national indoor meets have been confined largely to the Eastern and Middle States, but this year the West, South and Canada will be well represented. The athletic associations of Chicago, Philadelphia, Boston, Baltimore, Cincinnati, Cleveland, and Detroit are sending some of their star performers. The thousands of spectators who will throng the garden will have an unusual treat in seeing some of the star Canadian athletes in action against the champions of the United States. Heading the list of competitors from across the border will be W. Halpeny, the Montreal star. Halpeny holds the American indoor pole vaulting championship, having won this event last year. (Halpeny belongs to this city.)
