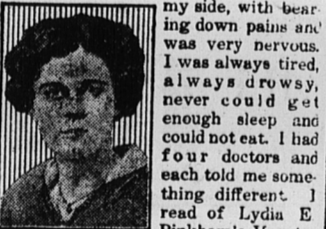

## WIN THE WAR CONVENTION MEETS

TORONTO.—A call for the Win the War convention issued last night, bears the signatures of over 125 of Ontario's most prominent citizens. In a footnote the executive explained that owing to the need for haste, many persons could not be reached, especially in the more distant parts of the province.

"We can count on their help and support," adds the notice. The objects of the organization, as will be laid before the convention when it meets August 2 and 3, are: That Canada shall dedicate all her resources of men and means to winning the war. That conscriptive measures be immediately adopted and enforced that a national non-partisan government be established for the vigorous prosecution of the war, that all patriotic elements in the country, which place the winning of the war above all other considerations, be united.

"We can count on their help and support," adds the notice.

The objects of the organization, as will be laid before the convention when it meets August 2 and 3, are: That Canada shall dedicate all her resources of men and means to winning the war. That conscriptive measures be immediately adopted and enforced that a national non-partisan government be established for the vigorous prosecution of the war, that all patriotic elements in the country, which place the winning of the war above all other considerations, be united.

WASHINGTON.—Increasing submarine tolls and Russia's apparent military collapse, make more aggressive British and American tactics imperative, navy and army officials declared today.

Great Britain's announcement of 21 major ships sunk the past week gave fresh fuel to demands among a portion of both services for a more active campaign at the heart of the U-boat menace, Zebrugge, and other bases.

The Admiralty statement frankly brought gloom in official quarters. In an offensive such as America military experts picture, aeroplanes would drop vast quantities of explosives on the great U-boat bases and land defences. An offensive against the German naval bases would be a gamble, but with things shaping as they are now, only a big gamble can be effective. The more skeptical say Secretary of War Baker believes the West front can be smashed. Men about him do not think it can, except through joint navy and army action, and then only by forcing hundreds of thousands of men against the northern end of the west front.

No Doubt of Final Outcome.

Washington.—Secretary of War Baker in a statement last night, formally announcing the return of the mission of American army officers sent to France to study technical questions in its praise of the splendid morale of the Allied forces on the western front, and while it shares the general realization of the gravity of this war, it has returned without any pessimistic opinions whatever as to its final outcome. The Secretary said he had inquired fully and found that there is no truth in stories published in various newspapers yesterday purporting to quote members of the party as saying that the German lines are impregnable.

## S'AM WILL STOP GERMAN PROPAGANDA

NEW YORK.—The entrance of Siam into the war on the side of the Allies will put a stop to the German propaganda there for the disruption of India, according to Rasmus Hanson, manager of the Russian-American line, who has been for several years in the shipping business as importer and exporter in Bangkok.

"Siam has been notoriously a base for the cultivation of plots against British rule in India. The kingdom is contiguous to Burma, to the northwest of here, and the Straits Settlements are to the south. The present King, Maha Vajiraudh, an adherent with liberal ideas, was educated at an English university, which may account for the attitude Siam has assumed.

"Before the war the Germans had a strong grip on the trade of Siam. They sought to do what the Siamese wanted them to do. The North
