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France Elects A New Administration Canadian Senator Has Close Call In Switzerland

Tardieu Gov't. Beaten At Polls

Majority Of Republicans Swept Away In Second Balloting Yesterday.

PARIS, May 8.—(Canadian Press Cable)—The Government of Premier Andre Tardieu was defeated at the polls today. The parties of the left, which have not been in power—except for a few days—since the famous "left Cartel" was established under Edouard Herriot following the 1924 general elections, swept away the Republican majority in the second ballot of the French general elections to the Chamber of Deputies.

With the tricolor everywhere dipped in mourning, France voted heavily to the left in the second and vital ballot. Forecasts were made everywhere that the assassination of President Paul Doumer would probably arrest the swing to the left already evident in the first ballot a week ago. The contrary was the case.

Canada Mourns With France

OTTAWA, May 8.—(By the Canadian Press)—Prime Minister R. B. Bennett has instructed Hon. Philippe Roy, Canadian Minister to Paris, to convey personally to the Government of France the deepest sympathy of the people and Government of Canada in the great loss sustained in the assassination of Paul Doumer, veteran President of the French Republic.

The Prime Minister further cabled Mr. Roy to express Canada's fullest appreciation of the high character of the assassinated President and of his long and patriotic service in which President Doumer had won a notable place not only in the annals of France but in world affairs.

CANADA HAS FAVORABLE TRADE BALANCE

PAINLEVE ALL FRANCE IS PRESSED TO NOMINATE

Veteran "Savior Of France" May Become Candidate For President.

Paris, May 8. (A. P.)—Paul Painleve, the veteran "saviour of France" and leader of the National Cabinet in 1926, was being pressed by his friends to become a candidate for President to succeed the slain Paul Doumer. It was learned that he was in communication with Edouard Herriot, leader of the Radical Socialists (Liberals) and that friends were saying Herriot had promised to support M. Painleve. The former Premier, however, was delaying his answer until he could consult with advisers. Meanwhile Albert Lobrun, the President of the Senate, who has been mentioned as the most likely choice for president today

All France In Mourning For Dead President

Nation Will Give Its Highest Honors To Beloved Doumer—Public Buildings Draped In Mourning.

PARIS, May 8.—President Paul Doumer, slain by an assassin, will be buried on Thursday in the Pantheon beside Voltaire, Victor Hugo and Jean Jacques Rousseau. The nation will give him its highest honors. There will be services in the Cathedral of Notre Dame to which the cortege will proceed from the Elysee Palace. Flags already are at half mast. Public buildings are draped in mourning, and all civil and military officials have been ordered to wear mourning for a month.

COURT TO BE IN MOURNING FOR DOUMER

Instructions Received Respecting Tribute To Deceased French President.

The following communications in respect to the death of President Doumer were received by wire on Saturday:

"Hon. Justice A. E. Arsenault, Administrator of the Province of Prince Edward Island.

"I have been directed to inform you that His Majesty the King has instructed that one week's Court mourning is to be observed for the late President Doumer of the French Republic, beginning May 7.

Flags to be half masted on the 12th day of May, the day of the funeral.

His Excellency the Governor General desires me to inform you that he has received the following telegram from the Lord Chamberlain: Begins Court mourning for one week the 7th instant, for late President of French Republic. Hurricane Takes Heavy Life Toll

HANOI, French Indo-China, May 8.—Five hundred persons were killed, including several Europeans, by a hurricane which swept in from the China Sea across the southern tip of the State of Annam last Wednesday, it was learned today.

Geneva Dinner Proves Fatal To Thomas

Senator Robertson Also Collapses But Is Said To Be Recovering—Police Investigating.

GENEVA, May 8.—Senator Gideon C. Robertson, former Canadian Minister of Labor, collapsed while dining with Albert Thomas, director of the International Labor Bureau, last Thursday, it was learned today.

Mr. Thomas also became suddenly ill in a cafe in Paris last night and died of a heart attack in a taxicab enroute to a hospital.

(Paris dispatches said the police believed his death was natural, but because of Mr. Thomas' eminence an investigation was undertaken. He had gone to Paris to vote and to pay his respects to the slain President Doumer.)

Senator Robertson was taken to a nursing home, where today it was said he was making good progress toward recovery.

The death of Mr. Thomas shocked international circles in Geneva, where he was regarded as a tireless worker for the improvement of the lot of the working man.

GERMANY CANNOT PAY

BERLIN, May 8. (A.P.)—Chancellor Bruening served notice today that Germany "cannot pay reparations," and predicted the European financial conference at Lausanne a month hence would lead the way either to world recovery or world collapse.

Addressing German provincial correspondents on the government's foreign policy, the Chancellor criticized the statements of the world for "lacking courage" and warned that "the peoples of the world won't wait any longer."

DOUKS OPENLY DEFY LAW

NELSON, B. C., May 8. (By the Canadian Press)—More than 150 Doukhobors openly defied the law by parading in the nude at Thrums today. They were arrested by police and lodged in jail here. A week ago 118 nude paraders were arrested at Thrums after a battle with the police last Thursday and were sentenced to three years each imprisonment.

SENATOR GIRROIR IS DEAD

OTTAWA, May 8.—(By the Canadian Press)—Senator Edward L. Girroir, Antigonish, N. S., died here this evening. The Conservative Senator has been indisposed for some time. He had been residing in Ottawa recently for the greater part of his life.

One Killed And 8 Injured When Landing Breaks

GRAND FALLS, N. B., May 8.—(By the Canadian Press)—One man was killed and eight others escaped with injuries when a lumber landing collapsed and fell 200 feet down a gorge near the plant of the Saint John Power Company here yesterday. The victim was Alfred Pardiff, 60, labor and war veteran.

HOOVER'S STAR IN ASCENDANT

WASHINGTON, May 8. (By Ken Clark, Canadian Press Staff Correspondent)—President Hoover's star is in the ascendant. A month before the United States Congress must adjourn or recess for the national convention, the Republican candidate apparently has the Democratic House of Representatives and the uneasy Senate where he wants them, in position to carry out his budget balancing and economy program.

Under the influence of direct and vigorous language from the White House and the public reaction of Thursday and Friday, the House ways and means committee for the first time since the war on Saturday raked the wrath of millions of veterans and killed for this season the proposal to immediately pay to ex-soldiers \$2,000,000.

Saturday night President Hoover pressed his advantage, unexpectedly conferring with leaders of the Senate upon methods of cooperation to immediately effect his fiscal plans.
