HORSE NOTES

Creseus, 2.02 1/2 the sire of the well known Island Trotter George Creseus, 2.24 1/2, died recently in Russia, aged 21 years. Creseus was formerly the champion trotting stallion of the world, and was noted for his great home stretch finishing.

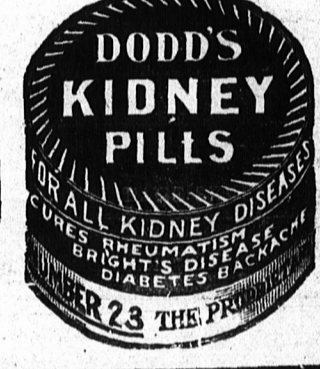
