**ISLANDER HONORED.**—A telegram received in the city yesterday announced the election of Mr. Marvin Brown, as Mayor of Medicine Hat, that thriving city of Alberta, by a majority of 35. **POLICE COURT.**—At the Charlottetown Police Court this morning the case of Truant Officer L.A. Auld vs. William Hogg on a charge of admitting boys under 14 years of age to the Theatre without a guardian, came up for hearing. A number of witnesses, mostly children under four, were heard and they claimed they attended the Theatre, and were there on the night in question. It was claimed by the manager that a number of these boys made their way in through the fire escape on the south side of the building, and even through the main doors when there was a rush. In summing up the evidence His Honor said the law clearly stated that if children were found in the Theatre, no matter how they got in, the manager was liable; he went on to say that he knew it was a hard proposition for a manager running a large establishment to keep a strict watch on all the doors. His Honor also drew the attention of the truant officer to a section of the by-law, pertaining to the duty of parents in this respect, which provides a fine for each time they allow their children to attend an amusement place without a proper guardian. His Honor imposed a nominal fine of \$1.00 on the defendant. The case of Benj. C. Bryenton vs. John Riggs, charged with using insulting language, was adjourned until the 10th instant. Two drunks, Joseph McDonald and Wilfred Gormerly, were fined \$10 or 30 days and \$6 or 20 days respectively.

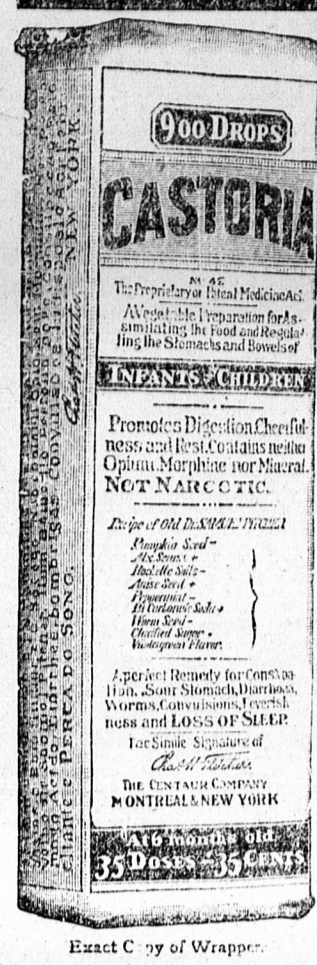
