Patrick O'Brien Murphy, Infantry, was officially reported admitted to the fourth General Hospital at Dammsies, Cambrige, on Aug. 17th with a gun shot wound in the left thigh and arm. It will be remembered that Private Murphy left here with the 105th. After going to England was transferred to the 13th Battalion. He was in the trenches nine months and his wide circle of friends wish him a speedy recovery.

No particulars were received but it is likely that he came to his death in the heavy fighting which has been in progress near Lens for some time. "Charlie" had a host of friends in Charlottetown who will deeply regret to hear of his death and sincere sympathy will go out to his mother and the other members of the family in their sad loss. They will have the consolation of knowing that he died fighting bravely.
