MAHONE BAY IS IN DANGER

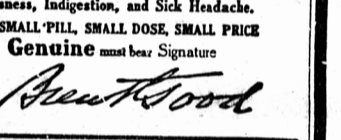
MAHONE BAY, Aug. 19-Sweeping north east and south east in the form of a triangle, seven miles long and destroying everything in its path, the fire which threatened Martin's River and Martin's Point was bearing down on the town of Mahone Bay late tonight. Mahone Bay and Chester were all in the danger zone. A large crowd of men from the former places had been out assisting the residents of Martin's River and Point in preventing the village being destroyed, but tonight they were compelled to return to Mahone Bay to help save their own town. Assistance had been asked for from Bridgewater, and that town was sending over its fire fighting apparatus.

WANTS WOMEN TO LEARN JIU JITSU.

LONDON, Aug. 20.-Addressing a suffragette meeting in Bromley, Sylvia Pankhurst said she had been criticised for causing a scene after the meeting in Trafalgar Square Sunday week, but she knew her duty was never to speak in Trafalgar Square without a fight. She added: "We have not yet made ourselves a catch for the police, and we have got to do it. The police know jiu jitsu. I advise you to learn jiu jitsu. Women should practice it as well as men. We have got to have drilling in the east and, if there is any man who has been in army or knows anything about drilling will be please communicate with me, and we will start drilling. You should all go out with your sticks. What is the use of us going out for a demonstration for freedom and going unarmed. Don't come to meetings without sticks in future. Men and women alike. It is worth while really striking. It is no use pretending we have got to fight."


