WORDS OF ADVICE FROM A N. Y. FISH FIRM

Wallace & Keeney Co., No. 10 Fulton Fish Market, New York, Have

Written The Guardian as Follows:—

"In your issue of December 7th, we notice an article headed, 'How to make money shipping smelts and sels.' The perusal of this article has moved us to express our congratulations and appreciation as we consider the advice to shippers of fish of excellent judgment and of value not only to the shippers, but to the receivers of the goods at New York. We have appreciated the necessity of impressing upon the fishermen the facts that you set forth to such an extent that we have gotten up a little almanac which we considered would be of much more value than the ordinary calendar that is usually sent out. As a matter of curiosity you may be interested in glancing it over as there is so much in it that coincides with your good judgment as manifested in the article referred to."

In the almanac here referred to that firm, in addition to information of various kinds, also gives the following advice to shippers:—

"There are many elements that enter into the market value of fish and other sea-foods. Some of the most important of these are the quality of the fish, the weather conditions at the time of capture, and the various factors that create the demand. But there are certain things that make for certain prices, the importance of which are oftentimes unappreciated, that are entirely within the control of the shipper. We therefore venture to offer the following few suggestions, which if generally observed and carried out will inevitably result in better returns and greater mutual satisfaction.

1. Fish should be handled very gently and carefully from the mo-
