Monthly Meeting Of Summerside Town Council

Intimations by some of the Councilors that the civic tax rate may have to be raised if expenditures continue to increase and a discussion on whether the fire department should respond to calls from outside the town limits were the main features of the regular monthly meeting of the town council held last evening. His Worship Mayor J. F. Arnett and Councilors W. E. Smallman and Henry Wedge. Councilor Lloyd Gorrell reported for the street committee that this department was doing a lot of work and spending a lot of money and the demands for work to be done are greater than ever and if they keep up he felt it would be necessary to raise the tax rate.

Councilor R. L. Mollison reported that the expenditures of the town for the six months of the year are over five thousand dollars greater than for the same period last year. He agreed with the speaker that the expenditures keep up it will be necessary to try to finish the year with as little spending as possible.

Councilor T. D. Morrison expressed his opinion that it will be impossible to keep the taxes the way they are and carry on. He did not think that the citizens in general would object very strenuously to paying more taxes. That is the impression he gathered from talking to some of the citizens.

Mayor Arnett said that Summerside has grown from a town to a small city and it is now necessary to install a fire department. He recalled that originally the department used to answer calls from many country districts but it was later decided that this endangered town property and it was discontinued. In the case he believed the persons concerned would be willing to pay. He felt they should be sent a bill, but he did not seem right, he said for the town to pay out sixty or seventy dollars unless it was repaid but on the other hand he said that it would be a built-up burn down when it is close to town.

Councilor Mollison said that the town council had the authority to pay for the fire department. He said that some people, he said, move outside town to escape taxes and yet they expect all the rights of citizens. Mayor Arnett said that some of the people expect too much and contribute nothing to the town.

A motion was then moved by Councilor McNeill and seconded by Councilor Mollison and passed that this department be authorized to purchase 1000 cubic feet of gravel. —S.
