Unemployment And The Fear Of It

In St. Peter's Cathedral on Sunday morning, Canon Malone preached on the present economic situation taking as his text, Luke XXI, 26: "Men's hearts failing them for fear and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth, the Canon said: "Everywhere today there is unemployment or the fear of it; every country is speeding up armaments and in Great Britain the adoption of conscription is almost certain. What is happening in Europe sees its counterpart in Japan, China, in modern Turkey and elsewhere. New currents of thought are in conflict for the control of the souls of men. Are we to have an unscientific theory of race and an exclusive nationalism, or are we to have the substantial unity of mankind? Are we to have a mechanical materialism, or a spiritual view of human personality? Are we to have self-contained economic states, or is there to be a just and fair partnership in trade and commerce?"

Three factors in the present situation have to be taken into account and these with them to solve the difficulty. These are the state, the community and the church.

The State—A new idea has grown up of the state and its functions. What is known as the "Totalitarian State" has come to be. It means a state which claims to control the whole life of every citizen; which considers its authority as supreme and even divine. It is independent of law, justice, scientific truth and moral standards. It seeks to create its own particular view of life in the minds of its people by the control of education, the press, the radio and religion. Severe penalties follow the remotest suspicion of opposition to its aims. Its fervour with which it exalts its power and the enthusiasm with which it preaches its doctrines have the compelling force of a religion. This making a God of the State replaces the Christian idea of God and the result is paganism.

2. The Community—This means the common life, the sharing of common interests by the citizens of a state. It shows itself in group life, in traditions and culture, in the family, in industrial societies and social classes. Each of these has its own loyalties, but are interwoven, and people in each have responsibilities not only to their own class but to all classes of society. How are these loyalties to be reconciled? How are the various responsibilities to be fulfilled? How are different communities in the nation, with conflicting interests, to live in peace, to preserve their ideals, and yet to contribute to the common good?

3. The Church—In this connection though we may hold very definite views as Anglicans and Catholics or Protestants as to what the church is, yet we must extend our view point to include the whole body of Christian belief throughout the world. The spiritual society which holds to a supernatural religion, which owns allegiance first to Christ, but which also shares the common general life of all other people, must, by virtue of its origin, its divine authority, its potential strength, proclaim those principles which shall govern the behavior of the State and community in their own particular spheres of authority. This Society of the Redeemed has no claim to political wisdom or authority, but can only set forth, the will of God; and here lies its plain duty in the conflicts of the present day. The Christian Society, then, must endeavor to compose its internal differences and declare positively what are the fundamental principles of life.

Outside of Great Britain and the North American Continent it is by no means certain just how organized religion will survive. The characteristics of these movements which show many of the characteristics of religion and are ready to turn manward, are few and far between. They are worshipped, because they hold sway over the immediate needs of men. The responsibility rests on the Christian society to interpret Christ to mankind as Saviour and King; to stand, not for its own security, even though that may be threatened and to stand, not for its own honor or glory, but for the sake of the world. The Christian society cannot keep silent, and still be faithful to him who is their Lord and life. Not the leaders only, but the rank and file, must consider the situation in which they are placed, must think over, study and discuss it, recognizing its importance, and be ready to listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit of God, to open their hearts to the inflow of His Power, to follow His guidance in these dangerous days, and thus be ready to give an answer to frame the action that must be taken to deliver the world that must be given if the world is to be saved from paganism and chaos.

MONTREAL, May 6—When Captain H. S. Hilton, the general manager of the white liner Lady Rodney, Canadian National Steamships, arrives at port here on May 7 after a voyage from Halifax via Boston to Bermuda, the Bahamas Islands and Jamaica, he will end his seafaring days with the company. He will then have reached his 66th birthday and under the rules of the company he must relinquish his command and go on pension. Captain Hilton took command of the liner Lady Rodney about three years ago and during this time has been regarded as one of the most popular masters commanding the fleet of "Lady" ships in the British West Indies service.
