CANADIAN WRITERS AND WRITERS ON CANADIAN SUBJECTS.

The announcement made recently by Toronto Saturday Night that the journal had arranged for the publication of a series of articles by Dr. Stephen Leacock and Dr. Andrew Macphail, once more serves to remind us that Canadian writers are now receiving deserved recognition at home as well as abroad. Dr. Macphail's published volumes, such as "Essays in Fallacy" and "Essays in Puritanism," to name only two of the many, have now a circle of readers both in Canada and England which the most optimistic would hardly have predicted at the time of publication. The work of Dr. Leacock, who is the author of "Literary Lapses," a volume which has set the world smiling, is of a less serious character than that of Dr. Macphail. His optimistic humor sounds the note, and the reader laughs in spite of himself.

The articles, as arranged for by Toronto Saturday Night, are twelve in number, and will alternate from week to week. For instance, on August 29th appeared an article by Dr. Macphail entitled "Canada's Loyalty," and on the following week Dr. Leacock's first humorous sketch, "How to Make a Million Dollars," appeared. The third article of the series, appearing the week of August 20th, is by Dr. Macphail, and is entitled "Nation or Empire." The second of Dr. Leacock's is entitled "Men Who Have Shaved Me," and will be printed in Toronto Saturday Night on August 27th.

Through such journals as Toronto Saturday Night, Canadian writers on Canadian subjects are finding a home market for their work, and are no longer obliged from necessity to patronize British and American publishers.

NORTH SHORE WOMAN FINDS SISTER LOST TO HER FOR 58 YEARS.

BOSTON, Aug. 25.—Mrs. Betsey MacCuish, of Malden, has found at Coughlan, Northumberland Co. (N. B.), a sister, Maria, Mrs. Peter Hassen, whom she had not seen or heard of for fifty-eight years. Mrs. MacCuish had endeavored to find her sister, but heard she was dead.

Mrs. Hassen was located through a friend in Malden who knew the family years ago. The youngest and the oldest of a large family of children, they were separated when their mother died. Betsy going to live with a sister in Annapolis (N.S.) and Maria being cared for by her grandparents, who lived in northern New Brunswick. In those days travel in the provinces was a more difficult undertaking than it is today and mails were quite infrequent, so the girls heard but seldom from each other. In time, Maria married and moved still farther away, and when her sister, Betsey, also married and came to the States, all communication between them ceased.

Mrs. MacCuish recently returned from Coughlan.

MINERS LEAVING.

SPRINGHILL MINES, Aug. 27.—One hundred and 14 men left Springhill to locate in Western Canada, including 69 foreign miners.

A fatal accident in the mines caused the death of a German miner. The deceased leaves a wife and two children in his native land. The body will be embalmed and taken to Germany.

SUDDEN PASSING OF A FAMOUS SCHOLAR.

CHOCORUA, N. H., Aug. 27.—Death caused by heart disease, came to Prof. William Jones, of Harvard University, Dean of American Philosophers and one of the world's foremost thinkers, at his summer home here last night.

VICTORIA, Aug. 25.—The foot note to the Methodist discipline forbidding dancing and theatre-going has been wiped out of the book by the General Conference.

The substitute clause commends the desirability of a holy life. The report of the Committee on Church Union was adopted after long debate by a large majority. This sends the matter down for consideration by the Annual Conference, quarterly boards etc.

TAKING OVER BRANCH LINES.

OTTAWA, Aug. 27.—Mr. Tiffin states that the Board of Management of the I. C. R. will likely make before long, a recommendation for the acquisition of certain branch lines under the Act of last season, but it has not yet been decided which will be taken. It is understood that certain lines, especially in New Brunswick, are applying their earnings to betterment in order to attain the standard required if they are to be leased by the government.

DRUNKEN SOLDIER FALLS OVER NIAGARA BANK.

NIAGARA, Aug. 27.—John Kelly, a Halifax Marine Engineer, fell nearly one hundred feet over the riverbank and was picked up on the lower bank without a bone broken though badly shaken up and internal injuries are feared.

Kelly spent yesterday with friends in Welland, came here last night and drank freely.

EMPEROR'S SPEECH IS BIG SENSATION.

BERLIN, Aug. 27.—A speech was delivered last night by Emperor William, before the Provincial Banquet at Komingsburg, in which he reiterated and emphasized his belief in the Divine Mandate by which he rules, and referred to the Prussian Crown as bestowed by God's Grace and not by Parliaments or peoples assemblies and laid a lance against the present movement for Women's Suffrage, is the political sensation of the hour.

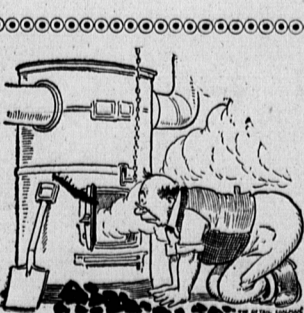

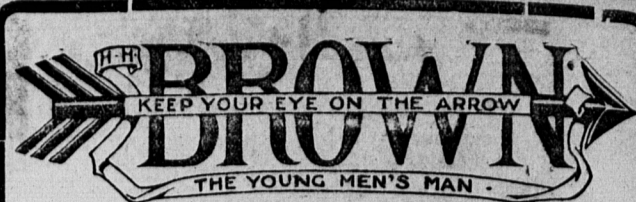
