ROOSEVELT GUEST OF THE KAISER AT SHAM BATTLE.

BERLIN, May 12—A sham fight in which 12,000 German soldiers of all arms took part occupied the attention of Col. Roosevelt and Emperor William for several hours this morning. After the battle, which took place on the field of Doberitz, the whole body of troops paraded before the ex-President and Emperor, who were standing side by side some twenty paces in front of the gorgeous staff. They saluted the colors of the various commands, the Emperor touching his helmet and Col. Roosevelt lifting his sombrero.

Speaking partly in English and partly in German, the Emperor, turning to Col. Roosevelt, said: "You are the first civilian who has viewed our soldiers," and then to the German officers: "We are honored in having here the distinguished colonel of the Rough Riders."

The former President was five hours in the saddle and spent much time talking with the Emperor. They drew apart from the others and at times were exceedingly vehement in their gestures. Col. Roosevelt wore a dinky khaki uniform, while the Emperor and his generals, in uniform of blue with gold helmets, made a striking contrast.

Col. Roosevelt said tonight that he felt quite able to deliver his lecture tomorrow before the University of Berlin. The Emperor probably will speak briefly upon the conferring of the doctor's degree on Col. Roosevelt.

President Taft's invitation to Mr. Roosevelt to represent the United States as special ambassador at the funeral of the late King of England was received this morning, and acceptance was immediately cabled to Washington.

A dinner was given at the American embassy tonight, the guests, in addition to the Roosevelts, including the imperial chancellier, Dr. Von Bethmann-Holweg, Foreign Secretary Von Schoen, the rector of the university, Henry White, former American Ambassador to France, and Mrs. White, and Seth and Mrs. Low.

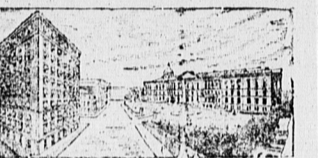

By Law to Amend a By-Law for Sanitary Purposes
 Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

(1) Section Twenty-Six of a By-Law for Sanitary purposes, being Chapter Fifteen of the By-Laws of the City of Charlottetown as consolidated and amended by adding thereto the following sub-section:—

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to spit, or expectorate upon the sidewalk or upon the floor, walls, entrance, steps, stairs or seats of any public building or other public place within the City of Charlottetown, and any person so offending shall be subject to the penalties of this By-Law and may be taken into custody by any police constable of this city.
