It is a good show, and the visitors have had a good time. Good order, good feeling and sobriety were characteristic of these days. It is good to look upon the satisfied with the world air of the numerous prize-winners in various departments of the show. Even the ticketed horse walks more proudly, as if conscious of his honors. The sum of happiness for old and young has been increased. These good results count for much to compensate the men and women who contributed their time, skill or money to make the show what it is, a credit to the Province. It is well worth while to have an Exhibition—isn't it?

**HON. MR. ROGERS' RESIGNATION.**

We are informed that Hon. Benjamin Rogers, Provincial Secretary and Commissioner of Agriculture and Cattle, has tendered his resignation of those positions to the Lieutenant Governor and that the same has been accepted. The news is of prime importance in several respects as it creates a vacancy in an important provincial portfolio, and is understood to mean also the retirement of Mr. Rogers from political life.

Mr. Rogers, although not yet an old man, has been active in Island politics for a very lengthened period. It was over forty years ago that he ran his first election, which was, however unsuccessful. He has since served with ability and credit in the old Legislative Council, where for some years he led the Opposition, also in the Legislative Assembly and since 1900 in the portfolio which he has now resigned. Many will regret Mr. Rogers' retirement, and The Guardian joins with them in the hope that in laying down the cares of office he may regain a full measure of health and strength which have been considerably impaired in recent years.
