The whole building which contains in all 24 rooms besides halls and closets was designed with a view to convenience and economy in space, and the design is almost faultlessly carried out. The material, finish and workmanship throughout are of the best, the building having been constantly under the personal supervision of the owner. This handsome building which will hereafter be known as "The Stratheona Hotel" has been leased for a term of years by Capt. J. S. Allan of the Terrace House, who has already commenced furnishing it preparatory to moving in the course of a few days. Those best acquainted with the prospective host and hostess Capt. and Mrs. Allen, will have every confidence in the future of the Stratheona Hotel which will no doubt in the very near future be one of the leading hostleries on the Island.
