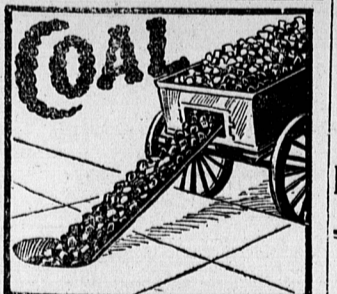

Kenneth Irving, Cape Traverse, was among the recent visitors to this city and left yesterday morning for Ottawa to resume his duties in the P. O. Department after a vacation spent at his former home.

By mistake the brown gelding Leonard H. nominated by J. B. Mitchell, Halifax, was omitted from the three minute stakes of the Charlottetown Driving Park races and is now published as No. 13 in that class.

In yesterday's issue that part of the article regarding the death of D. J. Bruce in Campbellton taken from exchanges was not separated from the main article as it should have been and the latter part implied that Mr. Bruce left Campbellton about twenty years ago when the city was meant.

In the last number of Zion's Herald, Boston, Rev. W. Harrison has a three column article on "Ecumenical Methodism." It is an historical summary arranged in chronological order to the event and instructions which have had so much to do with the making of the Methodist Church the contribution makes special mention of the great Methodist Council which meets in Toronto October 4th.

The Provincial Teachers' Convention which opens in the Prince of Wales College hall tomorrow (Wednesday) at 9.30 o'clock a. m. will be of more than ordinary interest. In addition to the provincial teachers who will take part, Hon. Payson Smith of Maine will be present and deliver two addresses. This will afford an opportunity for the citizens who are invited to attend the meetings, as well as for the teachers of the province to hear one of the foremost Educationists of America discuss the all important question of education.

A Political Meeting called by Prof. A. J. McPhail the Liberal Conservative Candidate as Coun. Man for the Belfast District was held in the Pownall Hall on Saturday evening. A. A. Moore was voted to the chair. Prof. McPhail was the first speaker and delivered what was said to be the most practical speech ever given in Pownall Hall and was listened to with rapt attention. The Prof. did not dig up Ancient History, no dilate on the sins of Omission or Commission of the Government but for order an hour held the closest attention of the ladies and gentlemen present, as he clearly and practically unfolded the reforms, and improvements, that he intended to institute and carry out. Notable, better roads and easier grades. Reform in Education, "The Tunnel," which must be completed at the earliest possible time, but in the meantime better transportation facilities, reduced railway rates, advocating the immediate placing of a ferry at the Capes, etc. He praised past and present Governments for what they had done for the farmers and promised greater things in the future. He eulogised Mr. Matheson as the coming leader of the Government, and promised him his hearty support in every good work. Another good plank in his platform was the announcement that, let the result be as it would, he intended to run a clean pure, election (hearty applause). The Prof. said he was proud and pleased to be called to serve his nation (Belfast) District, and it would be in the interest of every man to vote for him as he intended to act as to merit the approval of all. The Prof. took his seat amid loud applause from those on both sides of politics. At the close of the meeting the remarks were freely made "That is the most sensible political speech we have ever listened to." J. S. Martin the candidate for Assemblyman and T. B. McRae spoke briefly as the hour was getting late. After a vote of thanks to the chairman which was duly acknowledged, the meeting closed.

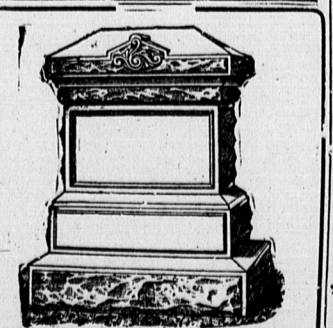
