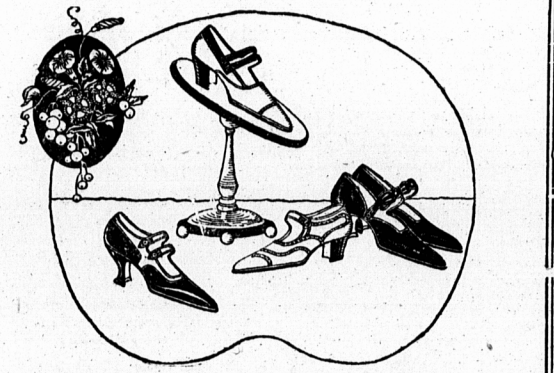

Ghost Story In Strange Murder Cases

NEW YORK, Aug. 17—A ghost story was injected today into the investigation of numerous murders in this vicinity and at Detroit which the police attributed to a gang called "the good killers."

Batholow Fontano, one of the seven men arrested last night in connection with the investigation and who gave information about the murders, said today, according to the police, that the ghost of Carmelo Caisseo whose back was fatally perforated by bullets at Avon-by-the-Sea (N.J.), appeared before him in the wee hours of last Monday. When the apparition came, Fontano was with Detective Michael Fiaschetti of the Italian squad. Fiaschetti related today how he was roused by the sound of Fontano leaping from the bed to the window.

"What's the matter," he inquired, "killed my best friend," Fontano was quoted as replying, "and I see his ghost."

Then, the detective said, Fontano had his orders and on July "He was instructed from across the sea to get Caisseo, but when he went forth to fulfill this mission, the attractive personality of Caisseo disarmed him and they became good friends. But Fontano was given his orders and on July 30 when they were out hunting together Fontano fired both barrels of a shot gun into his best friend's back."

Fontano happened to be the guest of the detective because the detective believed that the best way to a man's heart was through his stomach. When he met Fontano last Sunday in the Zoo, he was anxious to learn what secrets lay hidden in "good killer's" heart so he invited him to dinner. They became so chummy that a trip to the theatre following and afterwards Fontano agreed to be the overnight guest of the detective.

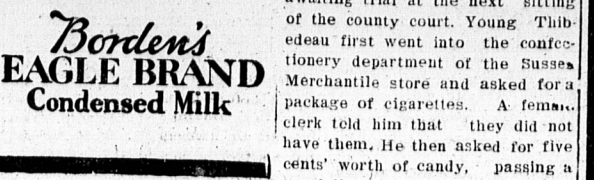

RUSS PRISONS SINKS OF DEATH

LONDON, Aug. 17—A scathing indictment of the Russian Soviet government by released American prisoners is contained in a Reval despatch to the Daily Express today.

Dr. W. S. Estes, arrested on the Russian border a year ago, after permission to enter the country, had been granted him, and Captain Emmett Kilpatrick, of the Red Cross, captured with Wrangel's army, in December, show the suffering they have undergone more than die others.

Both men are living skeletons. They arrived in Reval clad only in a few filthy rags, which would scarcely hang together.

Russell and Hazelwood, American soldiers captured from the Siberian expedition, also show the effects of their terrible experiences.

After three unsuccessful attempts to escape these men were imprisoned in a dark basement in Cheka for a month. They emerged with their minds slightly affected.

INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION TO HANDLE THE FAMINE

LONDON, August 17—According to the Sunday Times, an International Commission, of which Germany will be a member, will be appointed this week to proceed to Russia to organize steps to deal with the famine.

The information which was laid before the Supreme Council made a deep impression in London and it is now fully agreed that the relief work is a task beyond the powers of private individuals or even a single nation.

Alert Sussex Girl Causes Arrest Of Kent County Man

SUSSEX, Aug. 18.—Mathias Thibedeau, about twenty-five years of age, who came to town on Tuesday afternoon and is alleged to have immediately ten-dollar lots now lies in Hampton jail awaiting trial at the next sitting of the county court. Young Thibedeau first went into the confectionery department of the Sussex Merchantile store and asked for a package of cigarettes. A female clerk told him that they did not have them. He then asked for five cents' worth of candy, passing a ten dollar bill of the Royal Bank of Canada. He got his candy and \$9.95 in change and then went to G. M. Fairweather's drug store asked for cigarettes and handed Miss Thompson, a clerk, a ten dollar bill. Miss Thompson was suspicious of the bill and sent it to the Royal Bank, who pronounced it counterfeit.

Thibedeau was placed under arrest and locked up here for the night. This morning he was brought before the magistrate, H. W. Folkins, charged with unlawfully having counterfeit money in his custody and possession. After the hearing of several witnesses and the finding of three ten dollar bills, alleged to be counterfeit, in his possession the magistrate sent him up for trial and he was taken to Hampton jail on the 4 o'clock train this afternoon. Thibedeau says his home is in St. Louis, Kent Co., and that he got his money in Moncton.

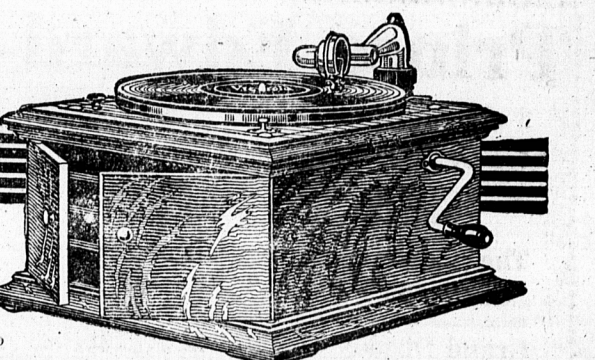

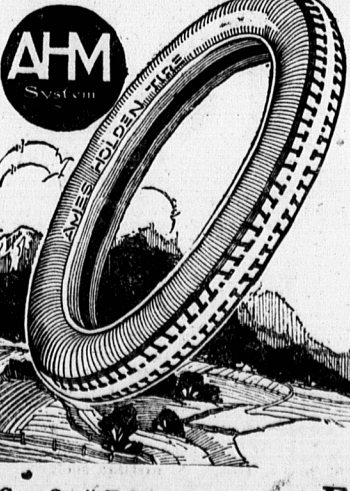
