THE repairing of the sidewalks by the aid of a nail barrel and pieces of board is certainly not "permanent work." Tourists will not be favorably impressed with their first view of Charlottetown's sidewalks if the one near Messrs. Duchemin & Co's factory is to remain in its present patched up condition. On another street the holes have been filled up with clay.

MESSRS. William Lawson and E. H. David, special salesmen, representing the Frost & Wood Co., Smith's Falls, are in the province in the interest of that large Agricultural Implement concern. THE remarkable excellence in athletic development attained by Island athletes will be no more strikingly exhibited in any event than the High Jump. A few years ago five feet 2 or three inches was considered a very meritorious performance and the athlete who could do that was lauded as a star. It is different now. In the High Jump at the Dominion Day Sports there will be no less than six athletes who can do over five feet, four of whom have attained the phenomenal height of five feet four inches. W. Teed of the Engineers recently made five feet six and one half inches in practice, a truly remarkable leap. Donahoe of Montague who captains the Montague Company track team has a record of five feet six inches made at the Maritime championships where he secured first in this event. From the foregoing records one can form some idea of the keenness of the competition in the different events and the excellence of the athletic material which will compete. The 100 yard dash will be the most exciting event ever held on the C. A. A. grounds. There will be about twenty entries in this event, including the two Ritchies, two McMillans, Bethune and Duffy. All these men have splendid reputations and they will certainly make the cinders fly in their efforts to breast the tape. Good judges predict that not more than two yards will separate those named at the finish.
