Three Half Mile Track Records Are Shattered

DELAWARE, O., Sept. 19.—Three half-mile track world records were shattered today at the Grand Circuit harness racing program.

Dusty Hanover, bay horse owned by Sullivan and Mawhinney of Machias, Me., clipped two of these marks in the \$2,000 First Division Pace. The bay covered the first mile heat in 2:00 1-2, breaking the 2:00 3-4 time established at Rutland, Vt., by Billy Direct.

Dusty Hanover, sired by Sandy Flash, then ran the second heat in 2:00 3-4 to hang up a new two-half-mile track record for the mile pace. The old mark was set at the Ohio State Fair in 1934 when Ray Henley was clocked at 2:02 3-4 and 2:02 1-4.

The fastest three heats ever run by three-year-old trotters on half-mile tracks came in the Chamber of Commerce \$2,500 purse trot. Remus, bay stallion owned and driven by Harry Short of Columbus, whisked around the first heat in 2:05 1-2. Kune, bay colt driven by Alken Stables of Alken, N. C., went the second heat in a world's record, 2:05, and won the third in 2:03 3-4.

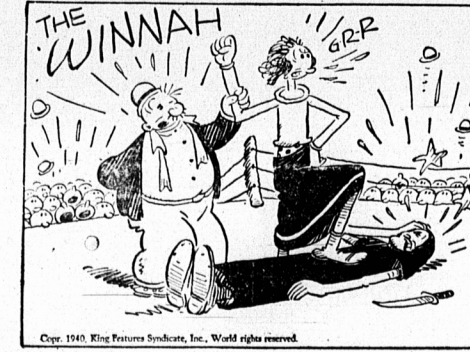
