Former City Clerk Of Charlottetown Dies In Detroit

Mr. A. E. Morrison of this city received a telegram yesterday afternoon, announcing the death at Detroit on Monday night of his eldest brother, Mr. William B. Morrison.

Mr. Morrison who was in his seventy-ninth year having been born on August 30, 1847, was the eldest son of the late Mr. J. W. Morrison.

He started life as a chemist and druggist with the late Mr. Theodore DesBrisay in 1864. In 1871 he withdrew from this partnership and opened a drugstore on the south side of Queen street.

Mr. Morrison was twice married, his first wife being Elizabeth Anne Howe, by whom he had one daughter, and his second wife, Agnes Muirhead, who with his son and daughter are living in Detroit and mourn his loss.

He was after 11 before any of the family returned from down town and released him.
