Spanish Situation Causes Govt. New Difficulties

Britain Not Prepared To Acquiesce In New Attacks On Shipping, Chamberlain Tells House.

LONDON, July 13—(CP)—The Government today disclosed new difficulties in its efforts to stop the rain of Spanish bombs on civilians and British merchant ships. At the same time the Government asked \$114,505,000 more for its air rearmament program, and fought off a House of Commons attack on its alleged failure to encourage home agricultural production as a safety measure in event of an aerial blockade in time of war.
