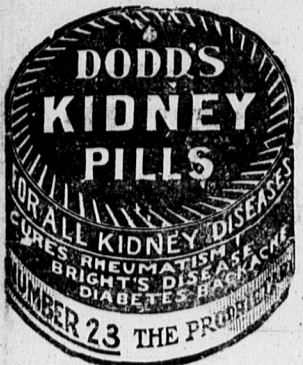

It is not surprising that the farmers are getting disheartened here in consequence of delay and postponement of better communication as they are the class who suffer the heaviest in consequence.

I would think that was the one vital matter to this Province on which you would not give sound sleep to your eyes nor slumber to you eyelids until there was a substantial move made to remedy the grievance we rest under at present.

I will say emphatically. Come out and work for us, or we will soon tire of The Guardian.

ANOTHER VICTORY FOR LABOR SCORED IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

ADELAIDE, June 6.—In the South Australian parliament, Verrall, leader of the labor party submitted a motion of want of confidence in the government, which carried by 22 to 19. The Peake cabinet resigned and a labor ministry was formed with Verrall as premier and minister of public works.
