Dodgers Squeeze Out Double Victory As Walters Continues Streak

Batting Spree By Yanks Swamps Browns Twice

NEW YORK, June 2 (AP)—A 26-hit batting spree by the Yankees in two games today swamped St. Louis Browns 13-4 and 11-1 and gave New York a record of nine American baseball league victories in the last 10 contests.

George Selkirk hit home runs in each game, his first with two on.

Joe Dimaggio also homered with one on.

Cleveland and Philadelphia divided a doubleheader at Shibe Park, the visitors winning the opener 7-2 and the Athletics coming back in the second for a 12-6 triumph.

Bob Feller held Philadelphia to eight hits in winning his eighth game in the opener.

In the second game, called at the end of the eighth inning, the A's pounded four Cleveland pitchers for 13 hits.

Detroit Tigers clawed the Senators for an 8-6 victory at Washington.

With Barmie McCosky on first, Hank Greenberg parked his eighth home run of the season to give Detroit a two-run lead in the first.

A wild throw by Jim Poffinbarger helped the Tigers add three more in the third. In their half the Senators went to work on Paul Trout.

The league leading Red Sox split with Chicago White Sox at Boston losing the first game 6-0 but capturing the nightcap 10-8 when Jimmy Fox blasted his 13th home run of the season with Ted Williams on base on the ninth inning.

Chicago grabbed the opening game as 38-year-old Ted Lyons chalked up his 225th major league victory. It was his fourth triumph this season.

As Lyons limited the potent Red Sox to six scattered hits, the Dukesmen pounded Bill Butland and Joe Heving almost at will.

Eric McNair homered in each game.

Looking like world champions, the New York Yankees finally reached the 500 level Saturday as they blasted St. Louis Browns 8-5.

The victory was featured by George Selkirk's three-run homer in the fifth.

Boston Red Sox who playing at home, edged out Chicago White Sox 2-1. Young Mickey Harris pitched seven-hit ball for the winners while Jimmy Fox belted his 12th home run of the season.

Lee (Buck) Ross held Cleveland Indians to two hits as the Athletics beat them 6-1 at Philadelphia. Hal Frosky got his 12th home run. Sam Chapman homered for the A's.

Helped by a 19-hit barrage from his sixth victory of the season as Detroit swamped the Senators 12-3 at Washington.

Six-run Rally Gives Royals 11-5 Victory; Bears, Leafs Split Pair

MONTEREAL, June 2 (AP)—A six-run rally in the final of the nightcap gave Montreal of the International League an 11-5 victory over the Orioles at Baltimore today after the Birds had won the opener 9-8. Montreal's rally broke a 5-5 deadlock that had existed since the third frame.

The Royals outlasted Baltimore in both games, but walks and clustered blows enabled the Orioles to take the opener.

Tut Stainback homered in each game. He and Jimmy Riddle came up with five safeties apiece.

The Bears and Toronto Maple Leafs split a pair of one-run decisions at Newark. The Leafs took the opener 4-3 while the Bears chalked up a 2-1 decision in the seven-inning nightcap.

Norman Branch and Johnny (Pretzel) Pezzullo hooked up in a mound battle in the second game. Branch yielded five hits, including a homer by Fern Bell in the fourth. Pezzullo gave up six blows.

The Bears outdid the Leafs 12-9 in the opener. Henry Majeski homered with none aboard in the ninth for the Bears.

Last-inning batting punch gave the league leaders, Rochester Red Wings, a double triumph over Buffalo today, 8-4 and 10-4, at Buffalo.

George Fallon's homer with the bases loaded in the ninth inning decided the opener. A six-run spurt in the extra eighth inning broke a 4-4 deadlock and clinched the nightcap for the Red Wings.

Second baseman Johnny Kroner's hitting was the highlight on the Buffalo side as he cracked two homers and three singles.
