### ISLAND PRISONER WRITES FROM GERMAN PRISON

The following letter was received from Lester Johnson, a prisoner in Germany since battle of Langemarch in April by his sister Miss Lou. C. Johnston, Peter's Road.  
L. C. Johnston No. 34 Oct. 16th. 1913

Dear Sister—  
Just a few lines to you to-day to let know that I am well and getting on all right. Hope mother is better ere this and that all the rest are well. I received your letter dated Sept. 12th. on Monday and received a letter from Maude to-day which I will answer as soon as I can. I am receiving parcels regularly but cannot understand you do not receive mails from me as I write a card or letter to some one near every week. I get letters from Vancouver right along and things seem to be about the same there as in other places very quiet. I hear that Jack McLean is in the artillery, are there any others those who have joined that I know? Do you know where Wm. McLure is, he did not come out to France when we did. Are you receiving my allowance right along if not let me know? I don't think there is anything that I need at present but will let you know if I should want anything. Well Lou there is nothing to write so we'll close. When writing to Summerville remember me to all there.

### ISLANDER PROUD OF HIS CANADA


The following interesting letter was received a few days ago by Gr. John Myers, Mount Albion, now on duty in the P. E. I. Heavy Battery in Fort Vives Halifax, from his brother Warren on active service at the front.  
Somewhere in France Oct. 28, 1915.

Dear Brother—  
Just a few lines to let you know that I am alive and well. Have had a few close shaves lately but a miss is as good as a mile. One night three of us were going out for rations when the Germans sent over for "coal boxes" We call them that but because they make such a black smoke and I can tell you they shake the earth around you for a mile. You can imagine four of them landing less than ten yards from us and making a hole anywhere from ten to twenty feet deep. We were covered with clay and the other two were wounded but I escaped with out a scratch though my head ached for days from the shock. But our fellows sent over a few big ones and they soon left us after that. I watched one of them land and explode and I think I moved a bomb and I have been taking G.I. 
