THE EXHIBITION

PROHIBITION COM'N RESIGNS.

The Prohibition Commission has resigned in a body. No explanation has been given as to why this step has been taken and there had been no previous intimation that such a step had been contemplated.

BACK TO BEGINNINGS

On May 13, 1919, Mr. J. J. Johnston, then a private member in Opposition and now Attorney General of this province, moved a resolution which in the light of events which have since transpired and particularly in the light of the speech which accompanied it, is more illuminating today than when it was concocted.

Whereas the province of Prince Edward Island, with the exception of our splendid undeveloped fisheries, is a purely agricultural province, with practically no manufacturing industries and has been since confederation a market for the manufactured goods of Ontario and Quebec without any corresponding benefits to this province.

The illuminating feature in connection with this resolution is not its bid for sympathy in demanding that all agricultural requirements be admitted free including fertilizers which are already free; not the idea of swinging Quebec and Ontario, which manufacture agricultural implements, around to the Prince Edward Island view that they should be admitted free of duty.

Here then we find the origin of the famous Liberal platform of 1919. Here was where the free implements and the FREE FOOD, THE FREE PORK and BUTTER and EGGS of the 1919 platform originated.

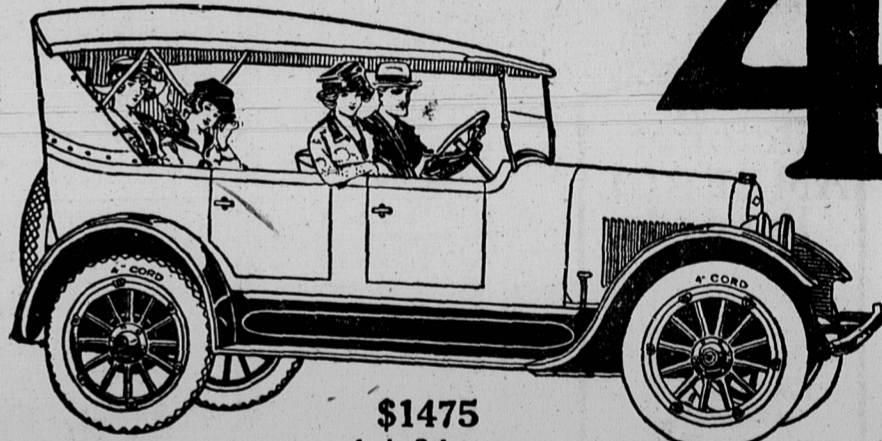
