SHIPPING A CENTURY AGO.—In referring to shipping from the port of North Sydney nearly a century ago "Occasional" tells in the Acadian Recorder that the first cargo of wheat ever sent from Prince Edward Island to the port of country departed in the ship Adelaide on the 11th of June, 1821. Two other vessels were loading for the same destination. 205,000 bushels of wheat had been already shipped that season for Quebec. During the month of June, 7 brigades of schooners and 23 coasters cleared from the port of North Sydney, C. B., with cargoes of coal. The use of coal in American steamboats had added considerably to the trade.

GOING FRUIT FARMING.—Mr. Fred M. Nash, teller of the Bank of Montreal here has resigned his position in order to take up fruit farming. He has bought an excellent fruit farm in Berwick, N. S., one of the finest fruit areas of the Annapolis Valley, and intends leaving in a short time to enter up on his new occupation. Mr. Nash, like many of our returned boys, feels that he must live the outdoor life if he is to preserve his wonted health and vigor. So many of the

returned boys feel the same after their experience in the war. As a proof of this it may be stated that there are now about three hundred returned boys settled on farms under the Soldier Settlement Board, in Prince Edward Island, and about three hundred and fifty in Nova Scotia, and the percentage of successful ones is exceedingly high—at least seventy five per cent. Mr. Nash has had a very successful career in the banking profession and it is to be hoped that he will meet with gratifying prosperity in his now undertaking. Anyway he will have the advantage that so many of our boys are longing for, namely living the outdoor life.
