IN MEMORIAM

RICHARD POPE NEWMAN A wave of sorrow spread over New Haven and surrounding community on the early morning of Thursday, January 27th, 1944, when it was learned that Richard Pope Newman had been called to the Heavenly Home.

Although he had been in failing health for the past few years, all his mental skill and tender nursing failed to restore him to health and the spirit of one who was so young and old passed a place every young surrounded by his wife and sons who mourn a loving husband and father. The deceased was born in Elmwood on November 1, 1876.

He was the son of the late Mr. Newman and his wife (former Mrs. James). He was one of a family of 10 children of which the following survive viz: Hamilton in Elmwood; Blanche, Mrs. Wm. Beer; Kingston; Herbert, Sask; Edith, Mrs. Charles Primm, Duval, Sask.

The remains were laid to rest in the Kingston United Church Cemetery beside his parents, sisters and brother. He was a member of the United Church of Canada and was very active in the services always taking a deep interest in all that pertained to his Master's Kingdom. He sang in the choir when only a young man and continued until sickness prevented it.

The funeral service took place Saturday afternoon and was largely attended by relatives and friends from different parts of the province. It was conducted by the Rev. J. R. Skinner assisted by the Rev. A. E. Todd. The following hymns, favourite of the deceased were sung: Nearer My God to Thee, The Lord's My Shepherd and Abide With Me.
