SPANISH STEAMER WAS TORPEDOED

WASHINGTON, May 9.—The torpedoing of the Spanish steamer Lusitania by a German submarine was reported today in a despatch from Barcelona. Her captain, the despatch declared, reported to the Spanish Government that the ship was sunk in the broad daylight and that the Spanish flag was flying where the submarine's commander could not help seeing it.

DAIRY PROSPECTS

Sir,—It will be somewhat gratifying for the patrons of cheese factories to know that the price on Canadian cheese is now fixed at 23 cts per lb. F. O. B. Montreal, an increase of 11 cents over last year's prices. This will give an increase of over eleven cents per 100 lbs. of milk less a set-off of about four cents per 100 lbs. for extra cost of hauling and manufacturing over last year, leaving a net increase of about seven cents per 100 lbs. milk.

It is wholly probable that the price of butter will advance in the same proportion. Managers of factories would do well to see to having their orders for supplies in early. Let their dealer know what their requirements for the season are likely to be, and so place him in a position to have their needs on hand.

Owing to the fact that farm help will in all probability be scarce this season, owing to the recent call of the Militia for men, and also to the change in time, directors should consider having the haulers start an hour later.

Dairying is an all important industry and every assistance should be given to increased production and co-operation, and dairymen of all classes should be thankful that in the midst of this Titanic struggle their condition has been improved.

POPE WILL NOT BE PARTY TO GERMAN PEACE OFFENSIVE

ROME, May 6.—Pope Benedict has served notice on the world that the Vatican will not be a party to "any peace offer" at the present time. It is believed that Berlin will seek to bring about a "German peace" and if its advances are repulsed, to nerve the German people to a new "bath of blood" by pointing out that the Allies desire to crush Germany. Pope Benedict has let it be known that he is desirous of taking any step which may tend to shorten the war, but he does not see at the present moment any reason to believe that an appeal would bring about the desired result.

Still Interested

"It is no secret," replied the Vatican authorities of whom the correspondent inquired regarding the report that he contemplated such a position "that the Pope, since the beginning of his pontificate, has interested himself regarding three great issues concerning the war:

First, to maintain absolute impartiality; second, to limit as much as possible the extent of the conflict and its horrors; third, to work in every way on every propitious occasion, to restore concord and brotherhood among the peoples.

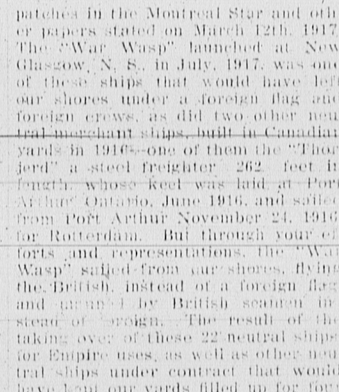

"Given this program, it is only natural that should a propitious occasion arise the pope would do his best to carry it out."
 "It is an easy task to prophesy from time to time within a few weeks or months, some new action on the part of the pope which may occur at any moment if a favorable occasion arises which, however, has not yet occurred, nor does it seem near."
 The original report of the imminent issue of a new papal move came from a German source, in the shape of an article in the *Neueste Nachrichten*, of Munich, late in April. This newspaper was quoted in Amsterdam despatches as stating that the move would be made "as soon as the western offensive assumed a new phase" and that it would take the form of a "word of warning addressed to the universal conscience."
 Cologne newspapers have later been quoted as declaring the pope intended to make a new peace overture on Whit Sunday (May 19) in the document of certain concrete offers of mediation by the pope. It was said, with the usual sibilant cooperation of neutral sovereigns, Berlin was reported to have received sympathetically similar information as to the pope's supposed intentions.
