**Army and Navy Veterans in Canada**  
Notice to Ex-Service Men

The Dominion Command of this Association intend to establish Units throughout the Province of Prince Edward Island immediately. All ex-service men interested in same should get in communication with the Provincial Director, for the Provinces of N. B. and P. E. I., Comrade C. B. Weldon, 691 Main Street, Moncton, N. B., who will forward full information.

To be eligible for membership in this Association an ex-service man must possess the following qualifications:—

ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP: (a) Received or is entitled to receive an active service medal for services in His Majesty's forces, (b) Had at least three years aggregate service in the regular forces or in the active militia or other auxiliary forces of the Empire, or (c) Served at least 12 months in the Naval forces of Canada, (d) At the age of 50 or over enlisted in the C. E. F. and served at least 12 months therein.

In order that the ex-service men of the Island may be thoroughly organized when the re-establishment question comes before the Dominion House all Veterans interested are requested to "God Save the King."
