LETTER OF SYMPATHY.

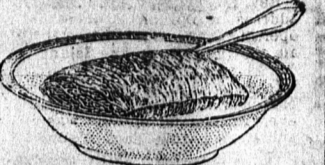

The following obituary is taken from the Morning Oregonian and the Dr. Nelson, referred to is well known in Charlottetown, and is a nephew of the late Mr. E. W. Match, and Mr. James H. Mutch, of Cymbria, P. E. I. It is a most unusual thing to have snow in Oregon to affect traffic.

Death was a race for life made by Mrs. Chas. R. Blair, of Lentz, Thursday night, arriving at the Good Samaritan Hospital at 3 p. m., she underwent an operation. She died at 11:20 p. m. Mrs. Blair went to Dr. David Nelson, in Lentz, suffering from a throat affection. He started with Mrs. Blair for the Good Samaritan Hospital, a distance of six miles. In Ladd's Addition the automobile foundered in a snowdrift. Four horses were hitched to the machine before it could be extricated. Frequently Dr. Nelson and the driver were compelled to halt and shovel out their course. Meanwhile Mrs. Blair fought for breath. On her arrival an operation was performed. In her weakened condition the patient could not rally, and death followed. She is survived by her husband Charles R. Blair. In the party working heroically against snow to save the patient were Dr. David Nelson, Dr. P. J. O'Donnell, Claude Coffin, I. F. Coffin and Mr. Blair. Realizing the need of attention Dr. Nelson made breathing possible for the patient by inserting a tube in the throat even before the hospital was reached.

SUN YAT SEN IS PLANNING A COUP

Tokio, March 20.—Advices from Chinese revolutionary sources state that 5,000 Government troops in Waichowfu, Province of Kwang-Tung, have revolted and joined the revolutionaries, who are planning a concerted attack on Canton. Should Canton fall, it is expected that Dr. Sun Yat Sen will proceed there and endeavor to establish an independent government.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years of age, who has a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency that has a Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A hrt table house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
