The cheese board was Red Point 50, Lakeville 120, St. Peters 100, East River, 84, Stanley Bridge 220, Red House 83, New Perth 140, Hazelbrook, 94, Hillsboro 120, Kensington 550, Union 120, Dundas 110, Cornwall 125, Gowan Brae 85, Winsloe 70, Kinkor 150. The highest bid first offered was by Henry Aitken of 7 1/2 but at this price none of the cheese factory representatives would dispose of their lots. The bid was increased by E. T. Higgs to 7 1/4. After considerable delay this price was accepted by Union, Dundas, and Cornwall. The Board was then closed.
