AUTUMN STYLES IN MILLINERY AS DEMONSTRATED BY M. TRAINOR & CO

Owing to having an unusually large amount of space taken up with furs, mantles, ready-made clothing, and wall paper on the second floor, the firm have decided not to hold a formal millinery opening this season, but all are welcome to come at their leisure and see the many beautiful models turned out of the firm's own work-room under the supervision of their popular milliner, Miss Walpert, and also view the imported models, with which the home productions compare most favorably.

Altogether the display is rich in suggestion, and remarkable for the individual character and smartness of the different designs shown. All the higher class models are distinctive and all charmingly artistic. In fact almost anyone of them, from their beautiful design and harmonious blending of colors, would at once proclaim their designer to be an artist of no mean ability, and indeed Miss Walpert has every reason to feel proud of the quality of the showing made, which while not yet as large, as on former occasions, owing to the fact that she has but very recently returned from abroad, it is still comprehensive enough to show the trend of fashion in the millinery world.

There is a radical change in styles this season, the new hats being strongly of the director type. They are for the most part large—some extremely so—and come in plain drooping and flaring brims. The crowns vary, some being high and flat, some derby shape, others drum shape, but all large in comparison with last season's. Turbans too are fashionable, many having crowns quite high, and shaped upon the hussah models, while the plainer sailor and other shapes are given the fashionable height. Richings of pleated ribbon, feather bandeaux and fancy bandeaux of many kinds, which encircle the crown, and are the newest idea in fashionable millinery. Satin hats are the latest fad and bid fair to be popular, also hats covered with ottoman silk and velvet.

A new feature this fall is the introduction of soutache braid, this being used on crowns and both upper and under brims, all classes of fancy feathers, wings, quills &c., give promise of a great vogue, as feather trimmed hats will predominate this season. Ostrich has, as usual, premier place, and promises to be more fashionable than ever, not only in the long sweeping plumes, but also in the shorter tips. Many fancy effects are shown in wings, feather pompons, aigrettes, buckle, coque, and heron plumes.

Flowers are used sparingly, but a huge silk and velvet rose, as well as beautiful shaded velvet foliage sprays, are noted. Large headed pins appear to the advantage and buckles medium and extremely large are very fashionable. Below is an imperfect description of a few of the models shown.

A large director shape, the brim of which rolls off the face is smoothly covered with a bright shade of navy satin, faced with satin in emerald green, a wide binding of navy velvet is placed around brim and the high crown is surrounded with band of same. Across the front is a large double bow of folded satin, caught with an extremely large old gold buckle, beneath which is fastened a willow plume shaded from navy to black, which falls to either side and partly covers the high crown. Price \$11.75.

A handsome hat in rembrant style is plainly covered with white ottoman silk, with handsome design in black soutache braid worked on upper brim, and faced with black panne velvet. A handsome bandeau in black sequin, with scroll design in silver, encircles the wide crown, with two sweeping white ostrich plumes tipped with black, disposed over crown and high rolling brim to right. Price \$19.75.

A very pretty hat for a young girl is in copenbaen felt, with mob crown of silk in same shade, trimmed with ribbon bows and streamers. Price \$3.75.

A hat of undoubted style in all black, has high crown, and brim flaring to right side, the crown sur-

rounding the face with slightly rounded by handsome jet bandeau carefully draped, the brim being round with sequined net. Two elegant plumes with cut jet ornaments completes a beautiful creation. Price \$19.50.

A very pretty hat is of new blue velvet softly draped around medium crown with folds of silk of same shade, and band of Persian embroidery. A huge silk covered button, decorated with soutache braid serves to confine large loops of folded silk at the front, while two Marabout wings in blue and taupe, are disposed on right side. Price \$8.00.

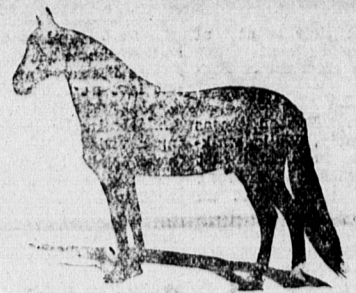
A beautiful imported hat is covered with satin in the fashionable taupe shade, the large round crown being given a still higher effect, by a feather bandeau in the same shade over folded mauve net. Two buckles in shaded mauve, and a large set wing complete an elegant creation. Price \$12.00.

A hat which bespeaks the artist's touch is a large shape with slightly flaring brim, plainly covered with champagne velvet, the underbrim being faced with old rose silk, a bandeau of folded velvet and silk, with a twist of champagne mairie surrounds the rather high crown, and is drawn through an immense buckle of gilt and cut steel at the front, ending in long loops. Protruding beneath the buckle start two ostrich plumes, shading from brown to champagne, while a single large rose with half opened bud, and spray of foliage shaded from green to rose, nestles in the folds of mairie. This is the work of the firm's milliner, and is indeed a masterpiece. Price \$16.00.

A pretty hat in medium size has trim rolling in front and covered with panne velvet in wine shade, the dome crown being draped all over with same material. Two shaded tips are fastened at front, under a single large rose with velvet foliage, and nod gracefully over the side. A fancy pin adds the finishing touch to a hat as useful as it is pretty. Price \$6.30.

Many more descriptions might be given, as there are hats at almost all prices from \$1.50 up, but all should lose no time in seeing for themselves, the many beautiful models both trimmed and untrimmed which are here for their selection.
