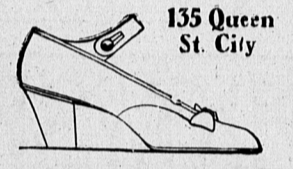

Court Dalvey, Canadian Order of Foresters at Hunter River, are having a special meeting on Friday evening of this week, 28th inst. This has been the banner Court outside of the city but lost it by organizer S. F. Tarbush initiating fifty-four new members into Court Hattie Stewart at Kingston, making the banner Court. By a dozen new candidates for Court Dalvey this week it looks encouraging for them to reclaim the honor. It is expected the boys will turn out and again put Banner in the lead.

Entertainment extended to the Canadian Parliamentary party by their English hosts was on a very liberal scale. The thirteen members and five Senators who composed the representatives were the guests in London of a committee of the House of Lords and Commons. This committee took the Canadians in charge on June 17th, the program of "town" entertainment extending to July 1st. Then came the "country" program, which extended to July 17th, and included an excursion to the principal industrial centres of England, Scotland and Ireland, and a visit to Wales to take part in the investiture of the Prince of Wales at Carnarvon Castle. It will be remembered that at the castle the Canadians were all presented to Their Majesties. Most of the Senators and members remained to participate in the entire program. The Englishmen, peers and other people, showed themselves masters not only in the art of dispersing hospitality, but of exhibiting the capacity of the old land in manufacturing and farming. The Canadian guests fully felt the activity, cordiality and hospitality of the hosts. They had prepared and presented an illuminated address emblemized with the arms and emblems of each dominion to the deputy chairman of the Lords and Commons committee, expressive of their gratification at the kindness of the House. It was addressed to the Earl of Bessborough, was signed by all of the Parliamentarians, and was formally presented in felicitous terms by A. B. Warburton, of Charlottetown, P. E. OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., July 24 - Buttermilk is a food and not a drink, according to a jury's decision in the District Court here in the case of J. T. Sims and M. C. Moist against the Oklahoma City Jockey Club. Sims and Moist paid the club \$200 for the soft drink privileges during the last year's racing meet. When Sims and Moist attempted to sell buttermilk they were stopped by the management, who claimed that their contract did not permit the sale of the lactical fluid, which it was asserted is a food.

MISSIONARY CONVENTION.

WOODSTOCK, July 24 - The Baptist conference of Young People's Missionary movement of Canada and the United States will open at Wood-

stock College today and continue all the week. Over 150 delegates will be in attendance, and these will stay at the college. The primary object of the gathering is to train leaders of missionary service. Prominent speakers of Canada and the United States are on the programme to speak.

TOBACCO DEBASEES BUSY BEES' HONEY.

WINSTED, Conn., July 24 - Beekeepers in this section are having a terrible time with their prize honey-makers because of a vice to which the bees have become addicted. The bees, it was found, have been going themselves on the nectar of tobacco blossoms. When one of the apiarists sampled the honey made by a colony of the bees he found that the honey was dark, ill-tasting and unfit for sale. A conference of apiarists will be held within a few days to decide whether it will be advisable to put the honey on the market as chewing tobacco.
