Winnipeg Grain

WINNIPEG, April 6 (CP)—Oats were traded actively today on Winnipeg Grain Exchange with prices showing a firm trend due to a fairly strong demand by seaboard interests.

Moderate shipper demand was also registered in barley, but trading was lighter than in oats.

About 465,000 bushels of wheat were allocated for export to the United Kingdom under the Anglo-Canadian wheat agreement.

Prices of class two wheat were reduced two cents from Monday.

Wheat prices: Oats: No. 2 CW 86 1-2; no. 3 CW and no. 3 CW 83 1-2; ex. 1 feed 81; no. 1 feed 79 3-4; no. 2 feed 75 1-2; no. 3 feed 71; track 79 7-8.

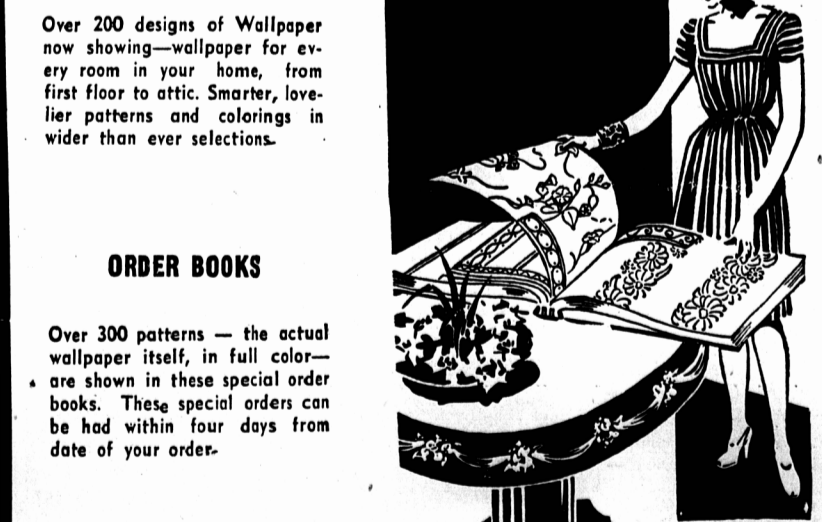
