PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE

(Continued from page one.) The matter would receive attention. PREMIER MATHIESON presented a bill to further amend the Game Act, 1906.

HON. A. E. ARSENAULT presented a bill "respecting certain departments of the public service." Bill read a first time.

The following bills reached the committee stage: An act to incorporate the O'Leary Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd., and the Casimiree Silver Black Fox Co.

HON. A. E. ARSENAULT moved for the second reading "an act to impose a tax on foxes in captivity in this province" and the House went into committee with Mr. Buntain in the chair.

HON. MR. ARSENAULT explained that the object of this bill was to tax only the annual increase, not the old foxes. The tax proposed was one per cent on the market value of the foxes.

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EVENING SESSION

The legislature resumed at 8.38. On motion of the Premier the House went into Committee to further consider the resolution on Supply.

HON. J. A. McDONALD reviewed the criticisms levelled at the financial policy of the Government. He regarded the external audit instituted by the Government as "absolute proof of the correctness of the financial statements given out."

The expenditure under the head of Administration of Justice has been very severely criticized. This amount was \$23,658, less than that in the last year under the late government.

With reference to the statement made by the Hon. the Commissioner of Public Works that the Senate at Ottawa rejected the bill for a grant of \$50,000 for roads he claimed that the Senate had returned the bill to the Commons for amendment simply because the bill was incorrect.

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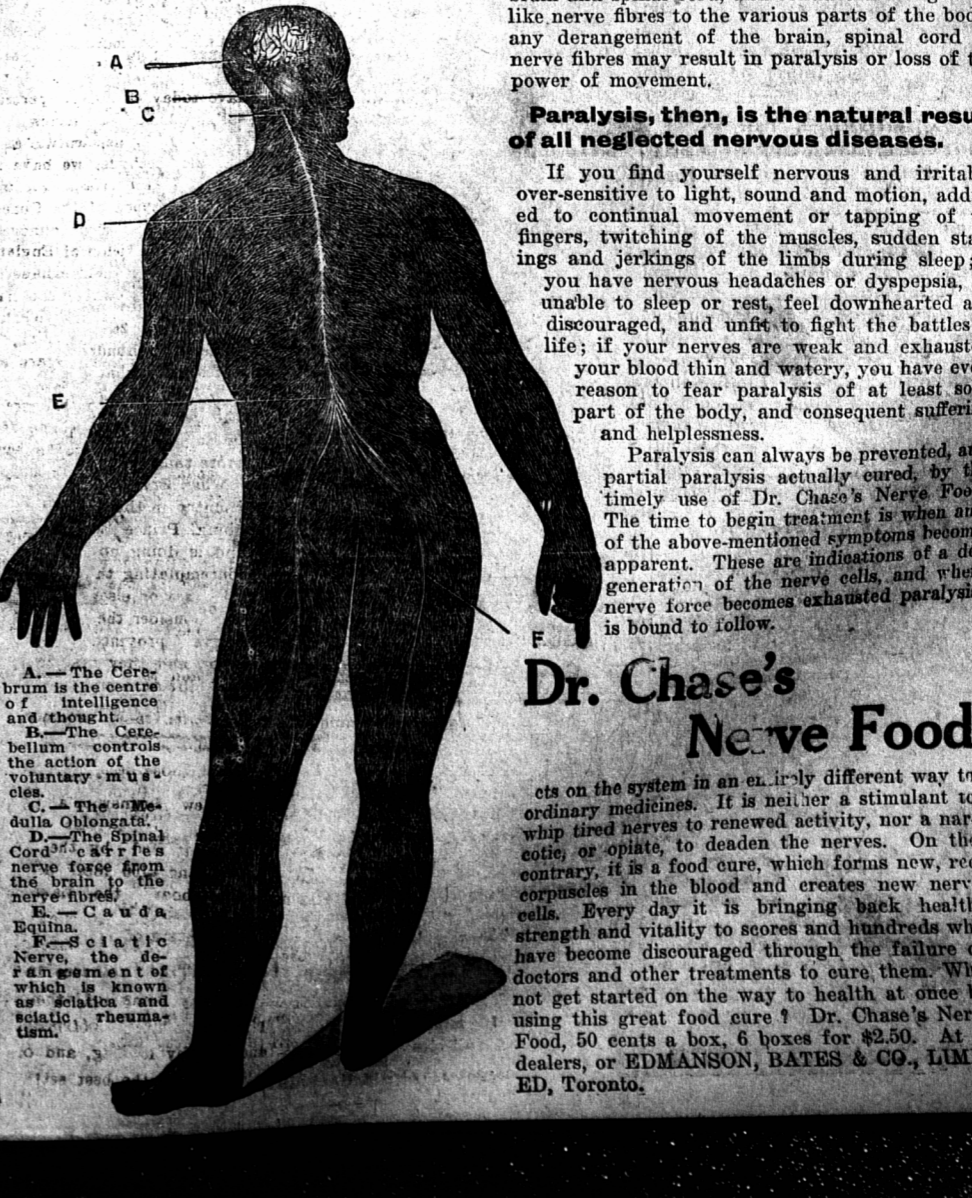
