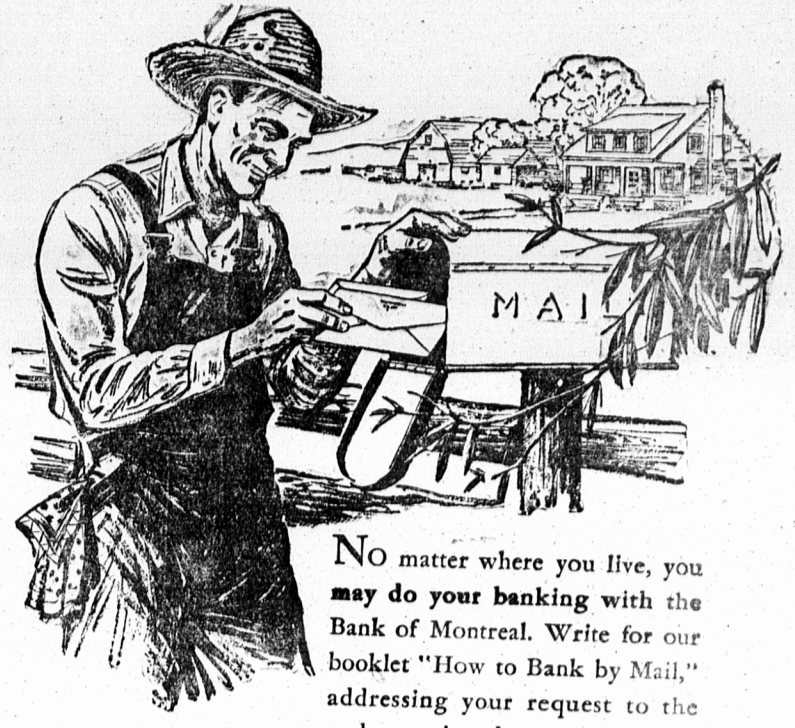

LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Oct. 5—(CP)—There were one head of cattle, 58 calves, 277 hogs and 100 sheep and lambs for sale on Montreal livestock markets today. Calves were unchanged. There were no tops. The few veals offered ranged from \$7.50 to \$9. Drinkers ranged from \$5 to \$9.50 and grassers were \$3.75 to \$4.25. Good ewes and wether lambs were \$7.50. Lambs weighing 100 pounds or better were cut \$1 per hundredweight. Culls and bucks were cut \$2 per hundredweight. Sheep were mostly \$3. Bacon hogs were \$9 feed and watered, and up to \$9.25 off trucks. Selects drew \$1 premium, with the usual cuts on off grades. Sows were mostly \$7.50. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$12.50 cold weight. On Maritime markets rail grade hogs were 50 cents lower at \$11-45. Sows remained steady at \$3 closed weight. Live hogs were steady at \$5.75. Cannons and cutters sold at \$1-50 to \$2.50. Other kinds of livestock were steady. Good steers were \$6.50. Butcher cows were \$4.50 and common steers down to \$4 good heifers made \$6.25, medium \$5.25, fair \$4.25 and common \$4. Butcher cows were \$3 to \$3.75 and bulls \$2.50 to \$3.25. Grass calves were \$3 to \$4 and veals from \$4 to \$7.50. Lambs sold up to \$7.

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, Oct. 5—(CP)—Losses of more than a cent were wiped out and Winnipeg wheat futures moved higher late today in sympathy with strength at Chicago and higher stock markets. Final quotations were 7-8-3-4 cent higher, Oct. 59 1-4, Nov. 59 1-2, Dec. 59 1-8 and May 60 5-8. Short-covering developed near the close of the session. Liverpool closed 1 1/4-1-2d lower. Buenos Aires was 3-8-1-2 cent off a ton. Cash wheat operations continued.
