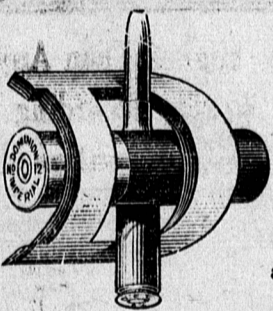
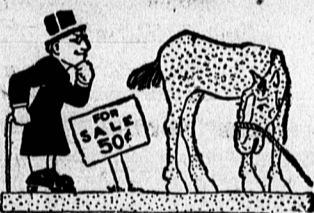

**PAINTING BUOYS.**—The Marine wharf presents quite a busy scene just now, all the buoys undergoing a thorough cleaning up and repainting. A number of them have been done in this way and the workmen are finishing the others.

**SAFE ARRIVAL.**—Mr. J. T. McKenzie received a cablegram yesterday morning of the safe arrival of his two sons, Wendell and Sargoon, in Shorncliffe, England. They left Halifax on the 18th, on the S. S. Northam. They enlisted in the Ambulance Corps in Montreal. The hosts of friends here will be pleased to learn of their safe arrival in the Old Country.

**EASTERN STEAMSHIP CO.**—The following from a St. John paper will be of interest to the travelling public in this city. S. S. Governor Cobb, arrived from Boston Tuesday evening via Maine ports, taking the place of the Calvin Austin, which has been hauled off for repairs. Since her return from the South she has been repaired and given a thorough overhauling at Boston, and is now in splendid condition. Capt. C. Clark, who had charge of her during the winter, is still in command.

The building will be 26x32 feet wide kitchen attached beside a verandah and piazza. The building is fitted up with all modern improvements, finished interiorly with oak and hardwood floors. Mr. R. E.
