BRITISH BRAVERY.

Forty-Five Against Several Thousand in South Africa—Capt. Wright's Splendid Performance at Kano.

As a War department the Colonial Office is most successful, and the operations against Kano and Sokoto were marred by not a single untoward incident. This was a campaign of drilled blacks against wild natives, and organization and the example of the white officers and non-commissioned officers told in favor of steadfastness of front, steadfastness of purpose, and endurance during long marches in waterless wastes. The relations of all concerned appear to have been most happy. Sir Frederick Lugard's despatch to Mr. Chamberlain says: "I have only to add to it an expression of the great pleasure which it gives me to record my keen appreciation of the accurate diagnosis of the situation made by the political officers; the foresight and thoroughness with which the necessary supplies (which proved amply adequate without excess) were collected at a minimum of cost, in spite of great transport difficulties; the ability of the leadership and the forbearance and disciplinary control shown in victory, and the eagerness, loyalty, and gallantry of all ranks." Gen. Kamball similarly compliments all concerned from Col. Morland and Lieut. Col. Festing downward.

One incident is narrated by Sir Frederick Lugard, which illustrates what wonders a British officer can perform with a mere handful of drilled natives:
 "I desire to draw your special attention to the very gallant fight by Lieut. (now Capt.) Wright, at Kano. That officer, with only forty-five men of the mounted infantry, hampered by carriers on foot, had been sent out to reconnoitre one of the roads along which an army of at least 1,000 horse and 2,000 foot were expected to advance. He established him to gain information that the main body was behind, and he could, at that stage, no doubt, have returned with safety. Meanwhile the general officer commanding sent to warn him that he would encounter large forces of the enemy, and left it to his discretion to act as he thought best. In those circumstances Lieut. Wright decided to maintain his position. He considered that, since the column was now 100 miles from Kano, and the enemy were more mobile than our troops, if he did not check them, even at the risk of annihilation, they would outpace our column, and (as Gen. Kamball says, "some thousands of men who meant fighting would have not past our left flank to Kano." He, therefore, resolved to make a stand with his forty-five men, with the result that he beat off the whole force with great loss. Had his little square been broken, or his men got out of hand, and lost confidence in their leader, the whole of the little party would, no doubt, have been obliterated. I consider that this very gallant action deserves special recognition. Capt. Porter's subsequent charge was also a very gallant performance."

Commenting on this splendid performance by Capt. Wright, Gen. Memball adds: "This was not been for the skillful and determined way in which that officer held the road with his small party against vastly superior numbers, a formidable body of fighting men would have succeeded in getting back to Kano, and I should have felt compelled to follow them with Col. Morland's column, a course which would certainly have prolonged the operations considerably. As it was, Lieut. Wright checked the enemy and headed them north, until Capt. Porter completed their discomfiture by his dashing charge."—London Telegraph.

Hen Oil for Incubators.
 An extraordinary step in the artificial incubation of eggs is the result of some years of labor on the part of Mr. E. V. Boyes, a young North London chemist. He has discovered that "something," the lack of which, from the time of the Egyptian downwards, has qualified the success of all artificial incubators. With the knowledge that the perspiration and its complex constituents of a sitting hen are important factors to a successful hatch, Mr. Boyes secured a quantity of the perspiration of a large number of hens feverish with the maternal instinct, and commenced experimenting. He found, on chemical analysis, that it consisted of a fatty matter, moisture, and an ethereal substance of acetic odor, with a little dust or dirt. Further experiments have resulted in his now offering the poultry farmer a novel article of commerce in the form of "hen oil." He claims that by putting a little of this curious concoction into the moisture tray under the egg drawer in the incubator, it will be automatically evaporated and diffused by the internal heat, and will do all the instinctive work of a sitting hen. But this is not all. Mr. Boyes has invented a tablet which will provide the lifeless incubator with "animal magnetism." The tablet also is placed in the moisture tray, and as it dissolves gives rise to a continuous non-varying current which aids in bringing forth a larger percentage of healthy chicks than is at present obtainable.
