The Wings had gone five games without a defeat with four wins and a tie.

LONDON, Oct. 31 — (CP) — Barbara Buttrick, 18, height four foot 11 inches, waist 23 inches, wants to become England's first woman professional boxer.

Every evening she goes straight from her work as a stenographer to Mickey Woods' West London Mayfair Gymnasium. There, under the guidance of Wood, former British lightweight champion, she goes through the training routine, bag-punching, skipping, and sparring.

She has been doing this for three hours every evening since July. And with sparring partner Len Smith, 22, her personal coach, she regularly weathers a couple of tough workouts.

She is the only child of a store-keeper Cottingham, Yorkshire, and came to London with the avowed intention of becoming a professional boxer.

"Three years ago," she said, "I read about Polly Burns, the prize fighter of many years ago and made up my mind to become a boxer like her."

"Women have done well in all other sports, so why shouldn't we box too? I am ready now to do some real fighting. I hope to make contact with other girls who are interested and to found a boxing club for women."

One Ounce Of Radioactive Atoms In Year

OAK RIDGE, Tenn., Oct. 31 — (AP)—About one ounce is the total weight of all the radioactive atoms shipped from here in one year by the Atomic Energy Commission.

That single ounce supplies 16 foreign countries, and more than 300 important laboratories of medicine.

U. S. Confronted With Major Reverse In China

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31 — (AP) — The United States is beginning to be confronted in China with the danger of its first major reverse of the cold war.

Officials show deep concern over military, political and economic reports from the embattled land. They no longer appear so confident as they once were that Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek's Government can revive its power of leadership and end the disastrous civil war with the Communists.

If Chiang's Communist foes continue their military successes and if conditions in the rest of China grow steadily worse, some authorities here rate two other long-range possibilities stronger than the chance for survival of the Chiang Government:

1. The Communists within a year or so may extend their mastery over all China — or so much of it that what remains out of their grasp would be insignificant.
2. Some new leftist government may emerge, combining political elements now active in Chiang's China with the Communists, to give the country peace and a new national administration.

Washington's official experts, considering the conditions which were brought on by the latest Communist success in China, still refuse to make any prediction. What they do agree on is that the prospects for realizing the American foreign policy aim of promoting a "free democratic and stable government" over all China appear extremely dim at the moment.

These same authorities are unwilling to say definitely, however, that even a complete Communist rise to power would make a wholly black outlook for American foreign policy.

15-Weeks-old Strike Settled Yesterday

ST. CATHARINES, Oct. 31 — (CP) — The 15-week-old wages strike involving 2,680 employees at McKinnon Industries, Limited, ended today.

Striking members of local 159, United Auto Workers (U.A.W.-C.I.O.) voted to accept wage increases offered by the company, ended the dispute which threatened to shut down Windsor and Oshawa plants of the parent General Motors Corporation. McKinnon's, a G.M. subsidiary, supplies castings for the Oshawa and Windsor plants and general managers of those plants announced last week they would close down because the 15-week strike had created a shortage of stock.

OTTAWA, Oct. 31 — (CP) — Norman V. S. Gregory of Montreal was re-elected president for a third term of the Canadian Figure Skating Association at the 35th annual meeting here Saturday. It was announced the Canadian figure skating championships will be held at the Minto Skating Club of Ottawa next year, probably late in February. The North American championships will be held in Philadelphia early in March.
