THE POTATO YIELD.—New Brunswick potatoes are reported as promising an increased yield of 25 per cent. over 1923, with little trouble from disease or insects, says the Fredericton Gleaner. The total yield has been estimated at 1,566,250 cwt. Practically no rot has been reported and the tubers are of good size and very clean.

THEN AND NOW—OUR RAILWAY. (Continued from Page 4) be far behind the age without the railway; and there would be a shout of protest if any part of it were finally closed.

In this connection, a statement published by The Railway Age of Chicago is interesting. It is stated that under the ownership and management of private companies the railway mileage of the United States has shrunk within the past eight years over the extent of 4250 miles; and the Railway Age remarks that "As a result of this reduction in railroad mileage, many communities have been left without railroad service and many railway employees have been deprived of work. Of course, the lines that have succumbed first have been 'weak' roads and unprofitable branches. If, however, success should attend the efforts of those who are advocating an even more restrictive policy of regulation, and a policy of railway valuation which would confiscate a least one-third of the value of the railroads, it would soon become necessary to scrap some large railways in every part of the country."

If the proposal to hand the C. N. R. over to a private company or companies should be adopted, the non-paying branches throughout Canada would in like manner without doubt be scrapped. The Dominion Government is under contract to maintain continuous communication between Prince Edward Island and the mainland; but there is nothing to prevent a private company from closing several of the branches which afford railway accommodation to the people in distant sections of this Province. The lesson is evident. The public company—the C. N. R.—which needs only to be so economically managed and so well patronized that there will be no deficits should be maintained by a greatly interested people.
