—WELL KNOWN RESIDENT DEAD.—The death occurred Monday afternoon in the Prince County Hospital of Mr. John L. McKinnon at the age of 91 years from aged infirmity. Mr. McKinnon was born in the Isle of Skye but came to Canada when very young. In early years he was one of the leading educationalists of the province and taught school in different parts of the province including Summerside. He founded the Pioneer in Alberton in 1874 which he conducted for some time latterly in Summerside.

—TOWN COUNCIL.—The monthly meeting of the Town Council was held in the town building on Monday evening, a full board of Councillors being present with Mayor or Campbell occupying the chair. The usual business being transacted, the matter of making arrangements for the reception of the Governor General who arrives in Summerside on the 29th was discussed and left in the hands of the Mayor. This includes the motor drive to Cavendish and lunches etc. He will pay a visit to one of the fox ranches. The inspectors report of the cattle are 20 hours slaughtered, one condemned, 47 cattle and 4 sheep all clean. The meeting was then adjourned until Friday evening when the electric light proposition will come up for discussion.

FIVE OF EAGLE BOAT DROWNED WHEN BOAT UPSET
 PHILADELPHIA, June 15.—Five of the crew of Eagle boat 25, were drowned yesterday when the little war craft was struck by a squall in the Delaware River and turned turtle. Forty-six men escaped. The men killed were caught in the engine room. One man chiseled a hole in the side while the vessel was floating bottom up and got out safely. A passing excursion steamer picked up the survivors and landed them at the Philadelphia navy yard.
