ability, and his promotions quickly followed. Mr. MacLeod continued in the Railway business since his beginning with the Grand Trunk, and step by step he steadily advanced until he attained the high and responsible position of President of "The Western Passenger Association," with headquarters at Chicago. For at least thirty years he had occupied this place which is one of the most strenuous and important in the whole railway system of the United States. Possessed of a magnificent physique and a vigorous constitution and having brilliant talents, Mr. MacLeod by training, self-education and unceasing endeavor discharged his onerous duties with the greatest satisfaction and won a notable name in the annals of railroading in the Great Republic.

During the war he over-exerted himself and never fully recovered his wonted health and vigor. Continuing his official duties, however, when absolute rest was urgently required, his health at last began to break and today we record with sadness his passing while still in what might be called the strength of his matured manhood. All who remember Mr. MacLeod in Charlottetown will recall his popularity, for his was a sunny nature, kindly disposition and friendly manner. He made friends with all with whom he came into contact. He was about sixty years of age, and it may well be said that his was a life of fullness and achievement. His character was admirable in every respect and he leaves behind him a record of a blameless life, devoted to duty, and a shining example of what true manhood and real worth are capable of accomplishing. Eben E. MacLeod's career reflects nothing but the greatest credit on the land of his birth. He leaves a wife and family to cherish his memory. To the bereaved in the home circle as well as to the surviving brothers and sisters we extend our sincerest sympathy.
