POLICEMAN SHOT.

MEDICINE HAT, June 5—Stripped of his gun and cartridge belt, and his horse missing, the lifeless body of Mounted Policeman, Frank W. Davies of Brooks, with a bullet through his heart was found lying on the trail last night, two miles southeast of Southfork. Two Indians and a half breed were arrested last night charged with the murder. A party of men were going into the Southern Alberta Land Co., were going into Southfork last evening, when they came upon the body of the Officer on the trail. The body was still warm and had only been dead for a short time. They immediately hurried to Southfork and sent the alarm to the Bassano Quarters of the Police. They hurried to the site and rounded up the Indians and halfbreed on a charge of killing the Officer.

J., June 5—Forty-five persons are suffering from ptomaine poisoning, the honeymoon trip of Charles and Mrs. Bishop has been abandoned owing to the illness of the newly married couple as a result of eating chicken salad at a wedding feast on Saturday night. The bride and bridegroom reached Buffalo, became ill and returned home in care of a physician. The victims included the bride's parents, the officiating clergyman, his wife, the caterer and all but two of the wedding guests. All are believed to be recovering.

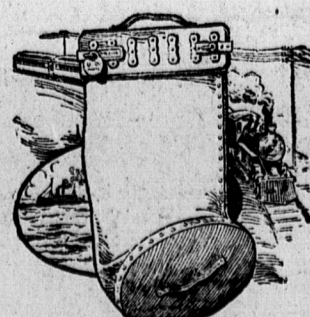

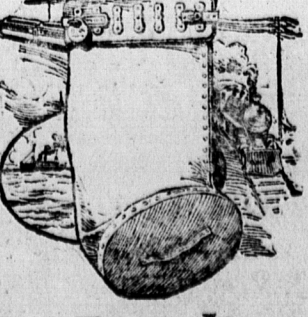
