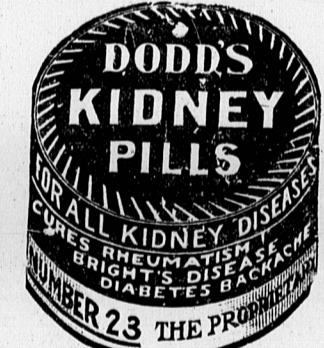

SWEDEN WON AND SMASHED RECORDS.

NEW YORK, March 15.—All indoor records were broken by Gustav Ljunstrom, the Swede runner from the 12th to the 20th mile in the professional race run tonight at the Madison Square Garden. Ljunstrom's time for the 20 miles was 1:50.58 35, as against the previous record of 1:57.25 15 made by Jim Crowley, of Ireland. Paul Acosta, the Canadian Indian, finished second, about 2 laps in the rear and Jim Crowley, third, and Sellen, of Toronto, fourth. There were eight starters. Ljunstrom took the lead in the twelfth mile and was never headed thereafter. He finished in good shape.

PAULHAN FLIES IN NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, March 15.—Louis Paulhan, the French aviator, made two short exhibition flights today at the Jamaica (L.I.) race-track in the Farman biplane in which he broke the world's record for height in Los Angeles by ascending 4,162 feet. On neither of today's flights did Paulhan go higher than 250 feet, and the distance in each case, a trifle more than two miles, was made in about five minutes. It was the first time the aviation experts and enthusiasts in the East have had an opportunity of comparing the French machine with the airplanes of the Wright brothers and of Glenn H. Curtiss. Although an 18-mile wind was blowing, Paulhan's control of his machine was perfect.

NEW CULT THAT HOLDS WAR AS A BLESSING

ROME, March 15.—An astounding reunion of Italian "futurists" has been held in Milan. "Futurism," according to the principal speaker, means a relentless and aggressive war against the cults of the past; it demands the destruction of all architectural monuments, the delivery to the flames of all museums and libraries, a "virile contempt" for women and the eradication of sentimentalism from literature, the drama and every other department of life.

Patriotism, militarism, must be exalted and great wars provoked because war is the sole hygiene of the world, without which races putrify. The vast audience which filled the opera house treated the proceedings as a huge joke and greeted the subsequent speakers with mocking interruptions. An indescribable pandemonium followed, while oranges, apples, nuts and other missiles whirled through the air between the contending groups.

PARENTS AND SON PLACED UNDER ARREST.

ST. JOHN, March 15.—A lively fracas, in which Charles and Jane O'Dell and their son Frederick were the participants, took place in their home in Brindley Street last night about 8 o'clock. The police were called to the house on three different occasions, and after being unable to restore peace and quietness, placed Mr. and Mrs. O'Dell under arrest. The son was also formally arrested, but he eluded the officers by making an exit through a window in the rear of the house. He was later caught and taken to central station.

When Sergeant Campbell and Policemen Smith, Covey and Haman were called to the house the last time they found matters to be in a very serious condition. Both Mr. and Mrs. O'Dell showed effects of having been badly beaten, their faces and clothes being besmeared with blood. The house, too, showed signs of a battle royal, the windows being badly smashed up. The pugacious couple were taken to the lock-up on a slyer. They are charged with keeping a disorderly house, and fighting together.

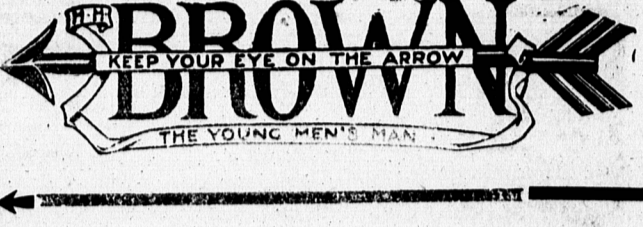
