HALIFAX, N. S., March 26.—Cables received tonight from Capt. P. W. E. Bates, of the Western Union Cable ship, Lord Kelvin, reported the drowning last night off Tampico, Mexico, of three members of the ship's company. They are: Stewart Allen, son of Andrew Allen, of St. John, N. B.; J. Downey, seaman, of Halifax; and Gerald J. Anderson, joiners mate of Halifax. Stewart Allen joined the Lord Kelvin at Keywest March 12th to pursue biological research in southern waters. He had studied under, and was assistant to, Prof. J. N. Gowanloch of the Dalhousie Biological Faculty, and was chosen by Professor Gowanloch as the student best fitted for the work.

under the terms of the act, and the constitution of Canada with which it must be read, were as follows: Prince Edward Island . . . 850 r Nova Scotia . . . 1,277 r New Brunswick . . . 1,371 r

When the several Provincial departments of Public Works and departments of Highways submit their programme maps to the Dominion Commissioner of Highways, late A. W. Campbell, C. E., only New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia had, at that time, standard forms of specifications the several types of construction highways and roads. Since, however, the Commissioner recognized that larger portions of the grant to which the several provinces became entitled, would be absorbed, in most cases, in costs of relocation, grading and consolidating, with light surfacing, he did not insist upon completion of standard specifications, as a condition precedent to entry into agreements. The case was met by the requirement that prior to entry into any agreement with respect to a portion of the system generally approved, a "project statement" of length of route, the industries served, the traffic present and prospective, together with a list of items of work proposed to be done, quantities involved, and their estimated costs, should be submitted to the Federal Commissioner of Highways. These project statements formed the basis of recommendations to the Governor in Council for approval of the several
