

HEAVIEST FALL OF SNOW IN ST. JOHN SINCE 1905.

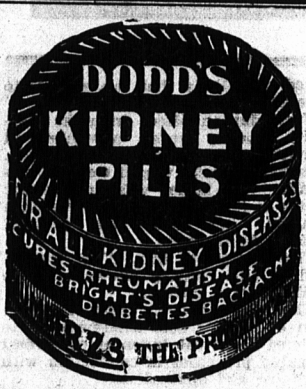

ANOTHER GERMAN YARN.

BERLIN, Dec. 19. (Via Aville)—The German steamship Prinz Friedrich Wilhelm of 17,082 tons, which had been anchored at Odde, near Bergen, Norway, since the beginning of the war, has arrived at Stavanger, according to a despatch from Kristiana to the Frankfurter Zeitung after having broken the British blockade outside Bergen.

"The time was," said A. L. Morse, of Berwick, N.S., the man who is said to possess the championship rights as apple-packer, "when I took everybody's

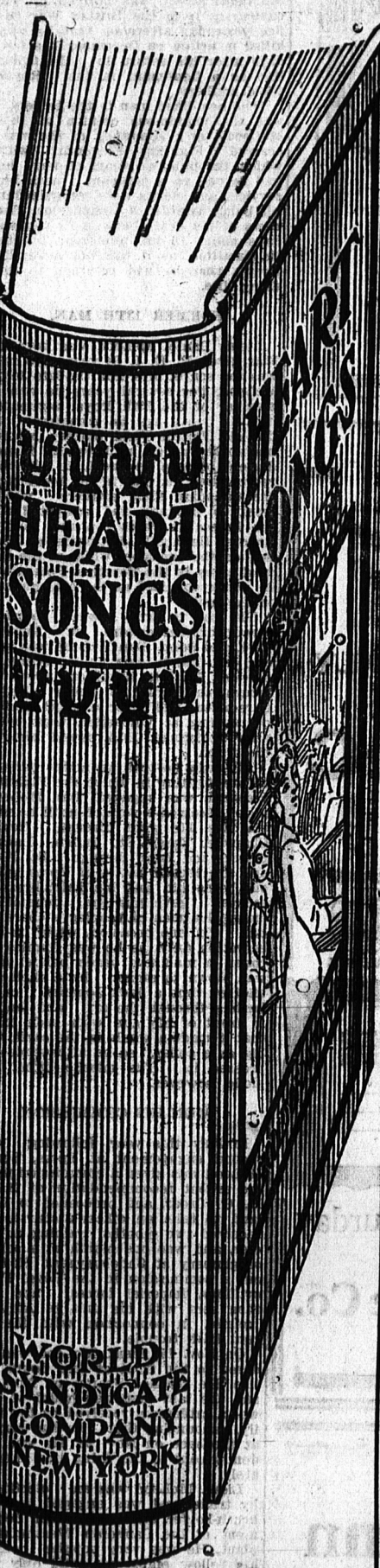
