ASK CONSUL-GENERAL FOR RETURN FARE

WINNIPEG, Jan. 15—A peculiar situation has arisen among the C.P.R. telegraphers here, resulting in an appeal to the United States Consul-General for assistance in the transportation of four United States operators back to the United States. For some time the local C.P.R. telegraph service has been recruited somewhat extensively in Chicago and other American cities. Four men were hired in the States some time ago and brought to Canada.

The local operators were very bitter at the time claiming that the Alien Labor law was being violated to bring these men in to hold as a club over them. Now the men have been released, and they, too, are sore. They have demanded transportation home, but cannot get it from the company, hence their appeal to the Consul-General.
