British Destroyer Warwick Is Lost

LONDON, March 1 (CP) — The destroyer Warwick was announced tonight. The Admiralty said the ship was an old craft, built in 1918. She displaced 1,100 tons and carried a normal complement of 134 men. The Warwick carried the flag of the first British warship sent for convoy duty along the United States east coast.

Employment Showed Drop At January 1

OTTAWA, March 1 (CP) — In a report on employment in Canada for the year ending Jan. 1, 1943, the Department of Statistics reported a decline in employment from 1,916,315 in Dec. 1, 1942, to 1,891,112 in Dec. 1, 1943. The decline was due to a reduction of 48,112 jobs in the manufacturing and construction industries, and an increase of 100,000 jobs in the service industries. The largest contractions in employment were in the textile, food, chemical, pulp and paper, and metal industries. The largest increases were in the public administration, health, and education services.
