The young husband was then arrested on a charge of abduction, the withdrawal of which charge this morning by the father enabled the young couple to be reunited.

### FRENCH GENERAL RESENTS ATTACKS

#### Protests Against Newspaper Criticism

LONDON, Oct. 18, (Special)—General Faure, commanding the Sixteenth French Army Corps, has addressed a long letter to the French Minister of War, protesting against attacks in the press by General Chomer, who accuses Faure of incapacity in the manoeuvres. Faure asserts that Chomer desires to shatter his career, and unless he is vindicated he will resign.

It has since been announced that the Supreme War Council has decided that Generals Faure and Plagnol, commanding the 16th and 17th army corps, respectively, shall be relieved of their functions because of incapacity shown at the recent manoeuvres of the French army.

In addition, the council has ordered that General Courtoisbeale, military governor of Lyons, two brigadier-generals of Lyons, two brigadier-generals and a number of superior officers shall also be relieved of their commands, as physically and otherwise unfit.

### IMPORTANT MOVE BY PREMIER

#### Question of Taxing Unearned Increment in Land Values

EDMONTON, Oct. 18, (Special)—Alberta is to take up the taxation of the unearned increment in respect to increased land values. Premier Sifton gave notice he would move resolution to that effect. This is the first move of its kind by any Province in Canada it was stated.

The tax will be on the basis of the increase in value from the time of the last sale and will be charged when the sale is registered.

This proposal aims to cover the annual fee in respect to land increases as is the case in the land tax proposals of the British Chancellor of the Exchequer.

While the amount to be derived from this source at the start is small it promises to become an important source of revenue in the future. The all-important thing to do at the present time in the opinion of the Government is to establish the principle.

### STARVING WOMEN NEED ASSISTANCE

#### Storm Victims of Nome Desert

NOME, Oct. 18, (Special)—Captain Ballinger of the United States revenue cutter Bear, informed the citizens relief committee he would advise his department at Washington that additional assistance was urgently needed here for sufferers from the recent food and storm. It was shown that a hundred or more persons, including many women and children, were destitute.

So far only \$10,000 for the relief fund has been received from the outside. The committee is at the end of its resources and is unable to provide further assistance without outside aid. Prospectors are arriving daily from the interior to find their homes have been destroyed by the storm.

### A \$14,000,000 WEDDING PRESENT.

BALTIMORE, Oct. 16.—Despite the efforts of the family to keep it quiet, it leaked out yesterday, the information coming from a reliable source, that Henry C. Frick has settled upon his son \$12,000,000 as a wedding present while the bride, who was Miss Frances S. Dixon of this city, received a cheque for \$2,000,000 as a present from her new father-in-law.

The bridegroom received his settlement some time before the wedding. For some days prior to the ceremony at Old St. Paul's Church yesterday it had been rumored that the elder Mr. Frick was to give the bride a handsome cash present, the figure being placed at \$1,000,000. This it now appears was only half the truth.

### ROYAL WEDDING GIFTS ON VIEW

#### Small Admission Fee to Aid Coal Mine Sufferers

LONDON, Oct. 18, (Special)—Anticipating the desire of the public to be privileged to inspect the Connaught wedding presents, His Majesty the King has directed that the gifts be placed on view in St. James Palace. This concession is also in accordance with the wishes of Prince and Princess Arthur of Connaught.

The King has further directed that a charge of one shilling shall be made for each admission, the proceeds to be devoted to the relief of sufferers from the Welsh coal mine disaster.

### FIGHTING RESUMED IN SAN DOMINGO

SAN DOMINGO, Dominican Republic, Oct. 16.—The rebels in Puerto Plata refuse to accept a treaty of peace and war operations have been resumed. Foreigners have been advised by the government to leave Puerto Plata.

SEE MOVE TO INJURE CANADIAN PORTS.

MONTREAL, Oct. 16.—A despatch received from Ottawa contains official announcement that the shipping interests, using the port of St. John, have just applied to the minister of commerce and labor for a board of arbitration under the Industrial Dispute Act of 1907 with reference to a dispute between them and the longshoremen of that port. The application is being considered here that if the demands of the men are conceded, the rates for stevedore service at St. John would be the highest on the continent.

Shipping men feel the movement has been backed up by the American International Union, whose headquarters are in the United States, they believe no doubt with a view to handicapping Canadian ports. In this connection some interesting disclosures are likely to be made.

Shippers declare that they would have no objection to recognizing a local union but they see no reason why an American union should interfere and attempt to dictate.

In view of these facts it is felt that some effort on the part of St. John to offer reasonable inducements to ship-owners to use that port should be made.

### BORES TO SAFETY IN TRAIN WRECK

#### Boy From New York Has Narrow Escape

LONDON, Oct. 18, (Special)—Patrick Lee, aged fourteen, who has just returned from New York, had an amazing escape from death in a train smash at St. James Station, Liverpool, by crawling out from beneath a bogie which was under the wheels of the engine and boring a hole through the debris of a wrecked car.

Ten persons were killed in the collision, including Ole Judnah, on whose body was found a White Star Dominion line ticket.
