WOMEN TO END WAR, SAYS MRS BLACK

NEW YORK, Sept. 9.—"War is a sham. War may be magnificent, but it is not good sense. Woman has decided to abolish war, and women can do everything, because they rule, those who command everything."

Such at least are the conclusions of Mrs. Elmer Ellsworth Black, chairman of the New York branch of the American Peace and Arbitration League of which William H. Taft is the honorary president and Henry Clews the actual executive. Mrs. Black reached New York on the steamship Caronia, but took the first train to Quebec, to deliver a lecture on universal peace.

In London she made many addresses in favor of what she considers "the most important movement on the world to-day," and she says that so great has been the impetus given to the peace agitation by the conclusion of the Anglo-American peace treaty, sometimes with her sprung up all over the United Kingdom. In London, the newly formed Anglo-American Peace and Arbitration League numbers practically all the prominent women of the British capital in its membership. The Duchess of Marlborough and other peeresses of American origin are actively interested. In short woman everywhere is now on the warpath for universal peace.

The emancipation of women, the most important development in modern history, was coincident with the dawn of the peace movement," said Mrs. Black in telling what woman has done for peace. "Not until woman became a free and independent being did the altars of the war god become deserted."

"The explanation of this coincidence is very simple. An emancipated woman is a reasoning woman, she has the follies and the crime of international strife. The world is the book of woman. Enlightened women saw how they were hit by war, even more than the men who served in the trenches. Not even the glory

came their way. Their portion was widowhood and penury. With the growth of death-dealing weapons this conception grew, till to-day it is difficult to find an enlightened woman who will admit that there is anything but insensate slaughter in wars conducted with ice-range guns between armies who rarely see each other.

"The recent wars in which America, Spain, England, the Boers, Russia and Japan were engaged gave woman all over the world new lessons. The horror and folly of war dawned upon women long before it touched the men. Women realize also the waste of war and women are the most practical in the world."

"The modern woman has asked herself, 'Why should one nation fight another over a dispute any more than I should fight Mrs. Smith next door when her dog wanders into my flower bed?' 'Why should I and my children be the victims of the armament maker, army contractor and concession hunter, when the dispute could be settled by the arbitration of justice and equity?' Looking at war as it is to-day, she says 'This may be magnificent, but is not good sense.'

"So we come to the present time, with the nations lining up in an Arbitration League. Women, dependent for women rule those who command everything, as the French proverb says. 'For years women all over the United States have been active members of hundreds of peace societies. The American woman is freer and broader education than her European sister, has taken the lead in the woman's movement for peace. In her own country she saw men of all nations living peacefully together, and that taught her that if men of different races could get along without quarrelling, the nations surely be able to get along."

"To cite one more evidence of women's activity, in peace," Mrs. Black concluded "consider the scout movement, that aims at making good citizens. The mothers of the world are urging them to behind that, because it affords a sound outlet for boyish spirits and a real training in the arts of peace."

"Out of that movement is coming a great federation of world scouts. England, Italy and America have already clasped hands, and Germany is coming. That is the beginning. Think of the prospect in ten years time! Today the women are influencing the best manhood of the world to our side. They are also rearing a generation of scouts trained to be independent in thought and action, and sworn to uphold the principle that 'the scout is the brother of every other scout, without distinction of nation or creed.'"
