MR. MCKINNON: The Government took them to be in earnest, and that in one reason why we should say very little about it.

ADD LEGISLATURE

With regard to the amount of \$7,000 which the Leader of the Opposition said was absolutely uncalled for and unnecessary, Mr. McKinnon said he would like to find today how many men in this province could stand up and say that a health tax or any expenditure in connection with health was uncalled for or unnecessary in this province.

MR. GEORGE E. HUGHES said there ought to be a special war tax on automobiles.

THE PREMIER: There is. MR. HUGHES: It should be increased at least \$10 a car.

MR. HUGHES: That is under provision at present.

MR. HUGHES went on to say that automobiles were an unjustifiable extravagance enforced on the farmers to a certain extent, and men who could afford this luxury should pay for it.

MR. J. A. DEWAR said that one year ago when this question came up he recorded his vote against it. At that time it looked as if in the coming year the Allies might have a favorable decision. Since that time disaster had overtaken Russia and now the Allies were fighting for their very lives.

MR. HOWATT expressed the opinion that the burden of taxation was not equally distributed.

THE PREMIER said he did not think the Opposition had brought any new light to bear on the question. The matter had been discussed ad nauseam in all the bye-elections since the last general election, in his own district, in Georgetown, Souris and St. Peter's, and the verdict of the people had been that they approved of it. It was all very well to talk about proper economy not being exercised. When the proper time arrived, said the Premier, he would ask

the Opposition to show in what respect economy could be exercised more than was being done. When the Government undertook to economize in one direction the Opposition said, "don't make it along that line," and so on. If the Government could continue to do during the war as they had so far done, they would have reason to congratulate themselves. As regards the Win-the-War Conference, in the light of what had transpired the members of that delegation might just as well have stayed at home. However, the object of the delegation at the time was one that commended itself to people generally and commended itself to both the Opposition and the Government. The Resolution was afterwards put to the vote and carried 13 to 7.

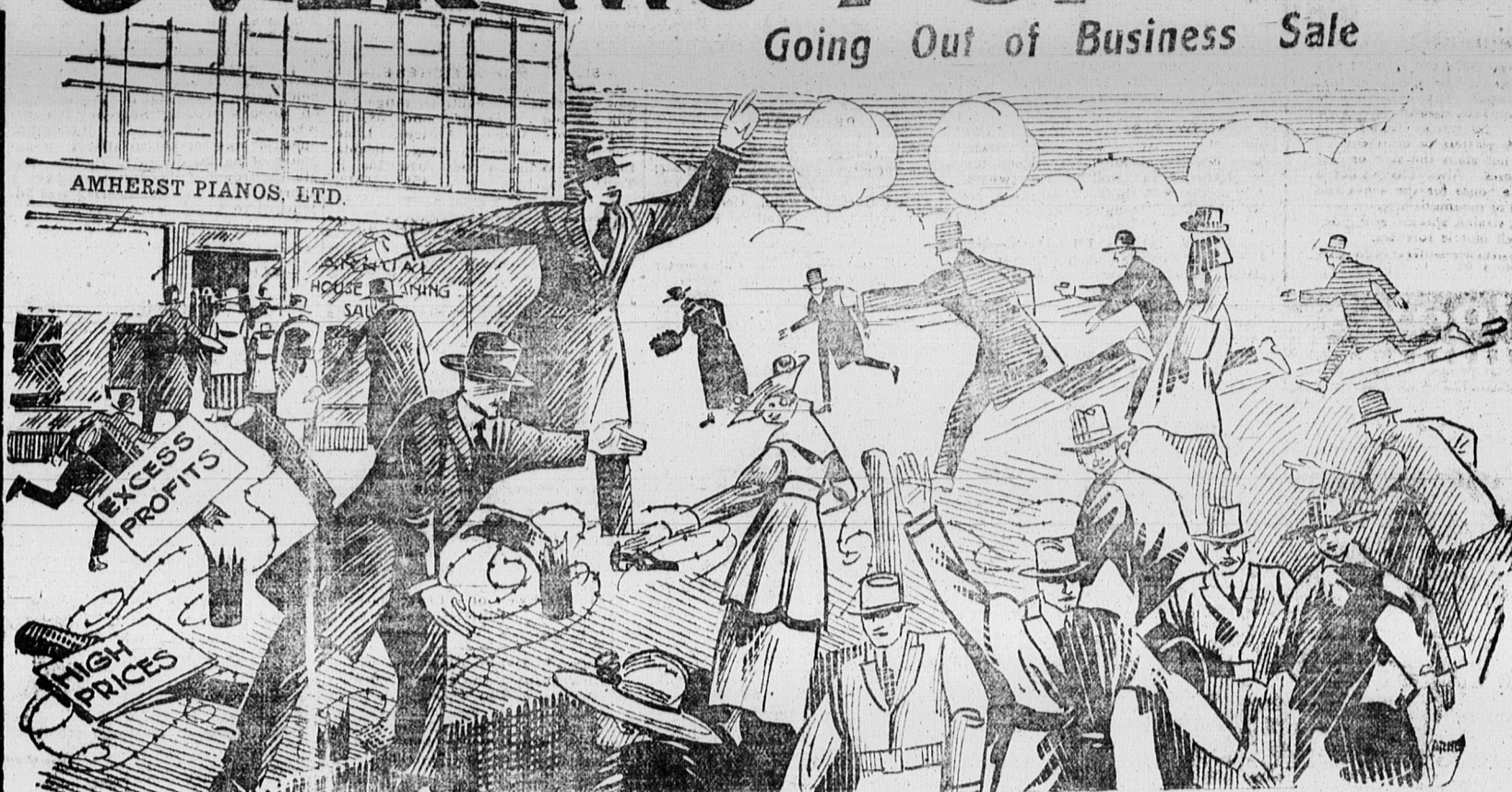
YOUNG MAN KILLED AT HARVEY, N. B.

HOPEWELL HILL, April 15.—A sad event occurred at Harvey Monday, when Ronald F. Robinson, son of Mrs. Mary Robinson, widow of Joseph Robinson, was killed through the accidental discharge of his own gun. The bullet entered the young man's forehead and death was instantaneous. The deceased was nineteen years of age and has been working for a neighbor most of the winter. Yesterday on account of a slight illness he remained at his home. He was in the kitchen, his mother went upstairs to do some work, and when the latter returned she was shocked to find her son lying on the floor, dead, with a bullet wound in his forehead the gun lying near him. It is supposed the gun was accidentally discharged while being cleaned. A coroner's jury brought in a verdict of accidental death.
